Update of COVID Precautions from Bishop Jaime Soto:

Bishop Soto is rescinding the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass.

Our church is currently open 100% of the seating capacity.

1. PLEASE BE ON TIME!! For Security Reasons: You will need to be on time - all doors must remain closed after mass has started. This applies to Adoration and other activities in the church.

2. Face Masks are still required

3. The two front doors will be open before mass. The outside door on the chapel side will remain closed and used for exiting only. Ushers/Greeters will need to monitor mask wearing as people enter the church.

4. We will continue to Live Stream the Sacrifice of the Mass for those who are unable to attend as we monitor the number of people who are using this service.

Reflection: Signs

Today's reading brings us full circle
as far as evangelization is concerned.
Three weeks ago Jesus sent out his dis-
ciples to proclaim the word. Last week
those disciples came back with a great
crowd of potential followers. Mission
accomplished. But now the question is
what are you going to do with all these
people? The answer, feed them.

The feeding of the multitude is the
only miracle that is recorded in all four
Gospels. What makes it so important?
During the Exodus, God fed the people
in the desert miraculously. The gospel
writers are showing us that Jesus is do-
ing what only God can do, feed people
miraculously. As disciples, we are called
to do as Christ did. We can't multiple
loaves miraculously, but we can volun-
teer at Loaves and Fishes. We can also
help the Sacramento Food Bank or our
own St. Vincent de Paul Society. Many
of us do. It may not be miraculous but
we are feeding the hungry as Jesus
would have us do. But in today's gospel
passage Jesus may be directing our
attention beyond our stomachs, to a
deeper hunger.

In the first three gospels, referred to
as the Synoptics, the feeding of the
multitude is a mighty miracle. But in
John's gospel, there are no miracles,
only signs. Christ's feeding of the
multitude isn't just a demonstration of
the kindness and compassion that we
as disciples need to exhibit. It's a sign
of something much greater. What is it?
We will find out next week.
