Update of COVID Precautions from Bishop Jaime Soto:

Bishop Soto is rescinding the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass.

Our church is currently open 100% of the seating capacity.

1. PLEASE BE ON TIME!! For Security Reasons: You will need to be on time - all doors must remain closed after mass has started. This applies to Adoration and other activities in the church.

2. Face Masks are still required

3. The two front doors will be open before mass. The outside door on the chapel side will remain closed and used for exiting only. Ushers/Greeters will need to monitor mask wearing as people enter the church.

4. We will continue to Live Stream the Sacrifice of the Mass for those who are unable to attend as we monitor the number of people who are using this service.

Reflection: *The Bread of Life*

In last week's gospel, Jesus miraculously
fed the hungry multitude. In to-
day's he shows us a way to satisfy our
deepest hunger by offering us a differ-
ent kind of bread, That bread is Christ
himself, the Bread of Life. In a homily
on today's reading, Pope Francis distin-
guished the Bread of life from ordinary
bread.

In a homily given in May 2019, he said,
"We have become accustomed to eat-
ing the stale bread of disinformation . .
. we end up drinking only indifference
and insensitivity . . . consuming distrac-
tion, insularity, and solitude." We have
become prisoners of virtual reality and
have, "... lost the taste of the truly
real." But then the Pope invited us to a
feast!

"Let us not be afraid to say it clearly:
Lord, we are hungry. We are hungry,
Lord, for the bread of your word, which
can open up our insularity and our
solitude. We are hungry, Lord, for an
experience of the fraternity in which
indifference, dishonor, and ignominy
will not fill our tables or take pride of
place in our homes. We are hungry,
Lord, for encounters where your word
can raise hope, awaken tenderness and
sensitize the heart by opening paths
of transformation and conversion." Bon
appétit!
