Desecration of the Body of Christ: Last Thursday, during Adoration, an unknown person entered the Divine Mercy Chapel. After the service started, the side door was left open. The Tabernacle was unlocked; this person took the chalice out, and threw the Consecrated Host (Body of Christ) on the floor. The incident occurred before anyone in the church noticed. This is a desecration of the Body of Christ. Reflection:

The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Years ago, while living in a religious community with the Holy Cross Fathers, I always look forward to evening prayer. That's when we would gather and sing the Magnificat as part of our daily office. The beauty and the powerful vision of this magnificent prayer always struck me.

In her song, Mary proclaims the greatness of God and rejoices in God's mercy and favor. She sings of a God whose strength will uphold the lowly and feed the hungry. But the canticle also reveals a God who will scatter the proud in their conceit, cast down the mighty from their thrones, and send the rich away empty.

These days, I do not recite evening prayer in a religious community. I read it alone and silently. However, when I get to the Magnificat, I can hear the echoes of Mary's canticle sung by men and women, moved by its beauty and challenged by its contradictions. But the song also gives me a sense of peacefulness and calm. Maybe that is because Mary, the mother of God and our comforter, first sang it.

In his Apostolic Letter dedicating this year, the 150th anniversary of the naming of St. Joseph as the patron of the universal church, the Holy Father described Joseph as a model husband and father. As a husband, Joseph accepts unconditionally Mary and the mystery of the virginal conception. As a father, the Pope describes him as beloved, tender and loving, obedient to God. We have long associated Joseph with the dignity of labor. He is the patron saint of workers. Today, we also identify Joseph with those who migrate from their homelands to escape hatred and violence just as he migrated with the Holy family to escape King Herod.

Pope Francis wrote, Joseph lived a life in the shadows. He was ordinary and therefore unseen by the powers that be in his day. But the Pope also observed that, "... our Lives are woven together and sustained by ordinary people, people often overlooked." St. Joseph was ordinary. But his kind of ordinariness revealed extraordinary virtue. We should follow the Pope's advice by reflecting on St. Joseph and striving to be as ordinary as he was.
