Desecration of the Body of Christ: Recently, during Adoration, an unknown person entered the Divine Mercy Chapel. After the service started, the side door was left open. The Tabernacle was unlocked; this person took the chalice out, and threw the Consecrated Host (Body of Christ) on the floor. The incident occurred before anyone in the church noticed. This is a desecration of the Body of Christ. Since this happened our church has been re-consecrated. **This is a security issue, and a reminder of the necessity of closing all doors after masses or services have begun. Please remain vigilant.**

Our church is currently open 100% of the seating capacity.

1. PLEASE BE ON TIME!! For Security Reasons: You will need to be on time - all doors must remain closed after mass has started. This applies to Adoration and other activities in the church.

2. Face Masks are still required, Regardless of Vaccination Status.

3. The two front doors will be open before mass. The outside door on the chapel side will remain closed and used for exiting only. Ushers/Greeters will need to monitor mask wearing as people enter the church.

Starting October 3, 2021 we will discontinue the Live Streaming of the 10:30am and 12:30 pm Sunday masses. On June 20, 2021, our Bishop rescinded the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. All the faithful are reminded of the perennial obligation to keep holy the Lord's Day by observing Sunday with prayer, spiritual reflection, works of mercy, fellowship, and rest.

Reflection:
21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Many years ago, Fr. John Gerber CSC, Rector of Moreau Seminary, on the campus of Notre Dame, stood in front of 28 newly arrived candidates for the Holy Cross Father. I was one of them. People were quizzing us about why we came to the seminary. But Fr. Gerber informed us that the question we should ask ourselves was not why did we come, but why do we stay? In today's Gospel, we read that many of Jesus' disciples abandoned him. Of those who remained, he asked, "Do you also want to leave?" My mind flashed back to Moreau and Fr. John's instruction. Why do I stay in the Catholic church?

I am a cradle Catholic. My mom taught me my prayers and took me to Mass each Sunday. The Sisters of Saints Cyril and Methodius guided me through the Baltimore Catechism in Catholic grade school. Dedicated laypersons taught me in CCD when I was in high school. In college and graduate school, I was privileged to study with the Holy Cross Fathers. I taught religion alongside dedicated laypersons, priests, and nuns. Today, the women of our St. Vincent de Paul Society include me as they serve neighbors in need. These people introduced me to God, formed me in the Catholic tradition, and inspire me to Christian discipleship. Vatican II got it right when the bishops defined the church as the people of God.

There are forces that push people away from Catholicism, and I am not immune to them. But there are also forces that pull me deeper into the church. Every Sunday, I worship with masked women and men so determined to keep the faith that even a global pandemic can't stop them. I need to be around people like that if I am to be a disciple of Christ. That's why I stay. Why do you stay?
