Desecration of the Body of Christ: Recently, during Adoration, an unknown person entered the Divine Mercy Chapel. After the service started, the side door was left open. The Tabernacle was unlocked; this person took the chalice out, and threw the Consecrated Host (Body of Christ) on the floor. The incident occurred before anyone in the church noticed. This is a desecration of the Body of Christ. Since this happened our church has been re-consecrated. **This is a security issue, and a reminder of the necessity of closing all doors after masses or services have begun. Please remain vigilant.**

Reflection:
22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

A mother gave her daughter sage marital advice. For men who are romantically inclined toward you, disregard what they say, but pay close attention to what they do. In today's second reading, St. James offers a similar council. "Be doers of the word and not hearers only . . . care for orphans and widows in their affliction. . . "Widows could not inherit property. They were by definition poor. James is clear; discipleship requires us to help the poor and the afflicted. How?

One way is to support our St. Vincent de Paul Society. If you contributed to today's second collection, you joined us in our mission to help the poor in our neighborhood. Our most common calls for help are for rent and utility bills. You are keeping the lights on and a roof over peoples' heads. However, people also suffer from a deeper poverty. St. Mother Teresa said that poverty in America went beyond economics and reached into souls. She saw loneliness and spiritual poverty. When members of our society visit people that call on us for help, we also pray with them. When you keep us in your prayers, you too are addressing neighbors' spiritual poverty. Our visits always end with an invitation to worship with us at our weekend Masses.

You don't have to be a member of our St. Vincent de Paul Society to be an active disciple of Christ. Although, we would love to have you. Call us. Poverty comes in many forms, and there are many ways to help people in need. We are called to help people in need, not because we are friendly people, but because we are called to be "doers of the word." How do you respond to our "widows and orphans in their affliction?"
