Reflection:

23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

I hate being told what to do. So, when I heard my wife order me to paint the living room, I immediately barked, "No." Unfortunately for me, what she asked was, "Please help me paint the living room on Friday?" What I heard wasn't what she said. As a result, I misspoke and mouthed off like a schmuck. Jesus never made a communication mistake like that. He knew better.

In today's reading from Mark, a man with a speech impediment approaches Jesus for a cure. Christ obliges him, and "...the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly." Jesus knew you had to hear correctly to speak correctly and respond appropriately. Commentators say the problems of our polarized world stem in part from our inability to listen to what our opposites are saying. The church may also have a hearing problem.

Recently, Pope Francis re-imposed regulations regarding the Tridentine mass reversing easements made by popes John Paul II and Benedict. Traditionalists believe that the best way to preserve the authenticity of the Eucharist is to celebrate the Mass in Latin. Other Catholics say that the best way to keep the authentic Eucharistic tradition is to celebrate it in a language the congregation can understand. However, at odds with each other, both sides seek the same end, preserving sacramental integrity. We should all remember that at that Last Supper, Jesus spoke neither Latin nor any contemporary language. He spoke Aramaic and prayed in Hebrew. We may be a little hard of hearing, but the Holy Spirit speaks plainly and will eventually open our ears, just as Jesus did for the man in today's reading.
