Reflection:

24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel, Jesus reveals the Messiah must suffer and die in order to establish the Reign of God. St Peter tried to dissuade him, but arguing with God is a losing proposition. It gets worse for Peter. He too, and all the disciples, must also pick up their cross and carry it as well. I wish Peter won the argument. What would the world be like if we didn't have to carry our crosses?

We wouldn't have any health care workers. Every day, most especially during the pandemic, these men and women carry the burden of taking care of people with a deadly, contagious disease. Most patients are unvaccinated, some through no fault of their own, but many by choice. Thousands are fighting forest fires, here and across our state. To me, a firefighter with a hose on his or her shoulders looks a lot like Jesus carrying his cross. Grocery workers wear a mask eight hours a day and expose themselves to hundreds of people, some of whom still refused to wear a mask. I can't imagine the anxiety they must feel. If people didn't take up their crosses daily, our world would crumble.

In the end, St. Peter got it right, literally. Tradition tells us they crucified him upside down because he felt unworthy. Seeing so many people carrying crosses daily, I too feel unworthy. But that feeling yields to a sense of gratitude and respect for them and for everyone else. We are all cross bearers journeying toward the Reign of God.
