Reflection:

25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

A friend of mine loves talking to my wife. She asks so many questions that he always feels like he is being interviewed by Rolling Stone magazine. As a high school religion teacher, I loved it when students pose questions. Unfortunately, many students cannot raise their hands out of fear of looking foolish or being labeled uncool. In today's gospel, the disciples can't understand the need for suffering, Christ's and their own, but they are afraid to ask questions.

Jesus is the consummate teacher in today's passage. He hears his disciples murmuring and calls them to task with a visual aid, a child. He instructs them to cultivate the virtues of a child. Researcher Warren Burger notes that between the ages of two and five, the average child asks 40,000 questions. The disciples need to learn the art of questioning. Many of us are in the same boat, but not my wife.

If she were one of the Twelve in today's passage the gospel would read differently. She would have plenty of questions. Why must the Messiah suffer? Why must disciples suffer? Why did you suffer and die for me? How can I say thank you? If you were one of the Twelve, What questions would you ask him?
