Reflection:

26th Sunday in Ordinary Time
 Most Jews did not accept the idea of resurrection or life after in Jesus' time. There was no concept of heaven or hell as we understand them today. Instead, they believed God sorted out the good from the bad here on earth. God rewarded the righteous with long life, wealth, and many children and punished sinners with sickness, poverty, and no descendants. The Sadducees' wealth and the temple priests' power were signs of God's favor. Given this context, our second reading must have sounded like blasphemy to first-century Jewish readers.

St. James's letter denounces the wealthy and condemnation of the Jewish elites and religious hierarchy is not just a socio-economic protest. It's a challenge to the very core of the Jewish religion. If the "in crowd" is not in God's favor, who is? The answer lies in our other readings.

In our first reading, someone complains to Moses that God the spirit of God poured out the spirit on to two Elders who were not present as required. Moses was unconcerned. In our gospel, a disciple complained that someone other than the disciples were casting out demons and doing good works in Jesus' name. Jesus is unconcerned. Moses and Jesus realized that God's grace is limitless and showered on whomever God chooses. All people are capable of good works. As Jesus said, "... whoever is not against us is for us."
