Reflection:

27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

There are 613 Commandments in the Hebrew Scriptures. The Ten Commandments summarizes them. Jesus reduced these laws to one. Love God with all of your heart and your neighbor as yourself. He summed it all up in one word, love. Why would the Jewish religious establishment want to crucify a rabbi who preached love? Today's gospel reading offers a clue.

In today's reading, Jesus teaches us that wives should not divorce their husbands. Mark probably directed this to Gentile converts. In first-century Judaism, only husbands could initiate divorce. Wives could not divorce their husbands. Mosaic law relegated women to a second-class status. Jesus appeared to be placing himself above Moses and the law to recognize the dignity of wives. Banning divorce would elevate and protect women. The religious establishment was outraged. Are we following Jesus' teaching?

Today, the Catholic Church walks a marital tightrope trying to protect the sanctity of the sacrament while safeguarding the human dignity of the spouses. It's difficult. I don't know of a family that divorce has not affected. They have all been painful. Some were even abusive. As disciples, we have to minister to men and women facing marital difficulties or divorce with the compassion of Jesus. As he showed us, it all comes down to love.
