Reflection:

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel, a devout man asks Jesus a really important question. "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus responds by falling back on Mosaic commandments; don't kill, committed adultery, steal, bear false witness, or defraud people. Honor your parents. But that's not enough. Jesus adds, sell what you have, give to the poor, and follow me.

Religious communities offer Christians an opportunity to embrace volunteer poverty. We revere St. Mother Teresa's Missionaries of Charity in part, for their embrace of radical poverty for the sake of the poor. But we all follow Jesus' teaching when we contribute time or treasure to those in financial need or suffer from social-psychological impoverishments like loneliness, grief, or discrimination. Jesus' instruction is not just focused on helping the poor.

The first part of Jesus' addition to Mosaic Law is to sell what you have. I see this as simplifying my life. The more I possess, the more my possessions possess me! Supply chain interruptions and utility outages are helping me realize I own things I don't need. People are losing everything they possess to wild-fires, and they all say the same thing. They are sad about what they lost but glad to be alive. Maybe the man posing the question on eternal life walked away sad, but who's to say that he didn't do as instructed and returned to follow Jesus? Christ is showing us the way to eternal life and revealing the secret of happiness here on earth; keep the commandments, live simply, help those in need and follow him.
