Enter to Learn, Leave to Serve

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus instructs his disciples to be leaders who serve rather than autocrats who lord it over people. In my years of teaching high school at Christian Brothers, I've had plenty of opportunities to see servant leaders in action.

All high schools function because of students who are servant leaders. These students volunteer to do the menial tasks school events require, planning, setting up for dances or plays, and clean-ups. They work hard so fellow students can have a good time, but fellow students rarely recognize their efforts or show gratitude. Being slighted doesn't bother them. They are true servant leaders.

Christian Brothers sends student leaders to a retreat at St. Mary's College prior to the start of each academic year. We have Mass and breakfast for about 25 departing students and their families. One year, responsibility for this event fell to me and a colleague. The maintenance staff set up tables and chairs the night before, but the clean-up was up to us. After seeing the last of the retreatants on the bus, we headed back, dreading the thought of clean-up. But when we walked into the dining room, we saw our president, Lorcán Barnes, lugging tables around. His pre-high school-aged sons were folding chairs while his wife was vacuuming the rug. This was a family of servant leaders.

For servant leadership, forget the politicians. We have plenty of servant leaders in our midst. Odds are, you are one of them!
