Reflection:  
30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's reading from Hebrews, the author likened Jesus to a high priest who is "... able to deal patiently with the ignorant and erring..." As a disciple, I'm supposed to imitate Christ. But I find it hard to be patient with anti-vaxxers. A New York teacher lost her job because she refused to be vaccinated, claiming a religious exemption. She is Jewish. The interviewer asked her where in Judaism are vaccinations condemned? She knew of no specific prescription, nor could she name any Rabbi supporting her refusal. Can a Catholic claim exemption on religious grounds?

Pope Francis made an appeal for all people to be vaccinated. Catholics can disagree with the Pontiff, but can a Catholic refuse vaccination on religious grounds when the Pope endorses it? The Vatican's Pontifical Academy for Life recently issued a statement urging Catholics to take the vaccine and also help others get it. Vatican City requires all employees to be vaccinated. They denied all exemptions on religious grounds. The Pope and the Vatican are adhering to basic Catholic Social Teaching, underscoring the sanctity of life and concern for the common good.

My neighbor suffers from a rare form of cancer. Her doctor ruled out our current vaccines because they will aggravate her condition and shorten her life. She remains quarantined, patiently awaiting a new vaccine or herd immunity. Thankfully, 90% of Catholics eligible for the vaccine have taken it or say they will. Only 10% have not or say they won't. That's a relatively small percentage. But would you feel safe on the streets if one in ten drivers refused to stop for stop signs or red lights? What would the Pope say to that?
