Today's Reflection:

Today's readings are apocalyptic and may seem frightening. The gospel sounds a bit like Stephen King. It talks about the sun darkening; the moon losing its light, stars falling from the sky, the powers of Heaven shaken, and the Son of Man coming in a cloud. These are scary images for us, but for Jesus and many of his Jewish contemporaries, they were good news. The Reign of Satan was ending. The Reign of God was about to begin.

God created the world and ruled over it. People enjoyed life, happiness, peace, and harmony. Remember the Garden of Eden with Adam and Eve? Unfortunately, Satan lured humanity away from God, promising us divine powers. There may be 613 Commandments but there's only one sin, blasphemy.

Humanity said "yes" to Satan and invited him to rule over us. The result was a reign of death and chaos. But God would not allow the Reign of Satan to stand forever. God promised a messiah to wrestle the world away from the grip of evil. When? As our Gospel reading tells us, in God's good time. But when the fight begins, you will see signs. Scripture talks of cosmic convulsions, but the signs that Jesus gave us are even more dramatic. He gave sight to the blind, made the lame walk, and proclaimed the good news to the poor. We, as his disciples, continue his struggle today.
