### Today's Reflection: Feast of Christ, the King

Pope Pius XI established the Feast of Christ the King in 1925 when he issued the encyclical, Quas Primas. The church establishes new feasts in response to people's needs. Our celebration today is an example. In 1925, the roaring 20s were in full swing in the United States. It was a decade of excessive self-indulgent opulence for Americans. In Europe, the carnage and aftermath of World War I was fermenting radical and destructive ideologies. Atheism and fascism were on the rise. Globally, individuals and states pursued their own interests with little regard for the common good. Pius felt a need to assert the moral authority and power of Christ. The image of Christ as king was the pope's attempt to offer an alternative to the narcissism of his times.

People refused to follow the will of God but instead pursued their own self interest or pledged allegiance to hateful philosophies. The pope felt humanity needed to return to Christ and acknowledge his authority and teachings. That meant returning to the law of love, forgiving each other, helping those in need, and worshiping God.

All this applies to both individuals and society. As Pius wrote in his encyclical, "When once men [and women] recognize, both in private and public life, that Christ is King, society will, at last, receive the great blessings of real liberty, well-ordered discipline, peace, and harmony." The human condition has changed little since the days of Pius XI and sadly, the Feast of Christ the King is as relevant and needed today as it was in 1925.
