Dear Families,

We have started the second quarter of the school year. The students have adjusted well to this school year. It is great to have all the students back to in person learning. I thank all of you for your patience while we continue to figure out the best way to keep students safe during morning drop-off and afternoon dismissal. Please remember to back into a parking spot. The spots in front of the back building are for families that have a situation that does not allow them to park in the side lot. We welcome any suggestions you may have to make the drop-off/pick-up more convenient during the winter months.

Yearly physicals/immunization reports- Please be aware we must have an updated physical and immunization report on file for each child. If your child's physical/immunizations are not up to date you should have received a reminder from our school nurse with instructions and a deadline on when to submit the updated form to us.

COVID Protocol Reminder— Remember if your child is not feeling well and exhibits any symptoms related to Covid including but not limited to runny nose and coughing we must have a doctor's note stating these symptoms are not related to the Covid virus. **Please do not send your child to school if they have any of these symptoms.** They will be sent home until we have the doctor's note.
