April 7th - Fifth Sunday of Lent - Jesus keeps God's promises.

In Ezekiel, God promises us that He will put His Spirit into us so that we may live, and we know that Jesus did that on the day of Pentecost. Also, Paul reminds us in his letter to the Romans that the Spirit dwells in us if we "are in the Spirit," and we can feel that instinctively after we celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Unfortunately, though, it is often easy for us to forget that Jesus keeps God's promises revealed in the Scriptures.

Even Martha, one of Jesus' closest friends had to be reminded of that in today's Gospel. In the story of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead, Jesus reminds Martha "Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?" Today is a good reminder for us that despite any concerns or sufferings we have in this life, we can look forward to the fulfillment of God's promises in the next. Do you believe that Jesus keeps His promises? How can we help others remember that Jesus keeps His promises?

ARCHDIOCESAN DEACON'S DIAPER DRIVE

The permanent deacons of the archdiocese, in conjunction with the Respect Life Apostolate, are sponsoring the fourth annual diocesan-wide diaper drive for newborns, infants and toddlers in parishes. Collection at St Jude will be from this weekend until April 14th.

LOAVES AND FISHES is a thriving food pantry and homeless shelter that provides food for over 300 people and housing for over 300 families each year. Loaves and Fishes exists to serve those who have been struck by economic hardships, providing them with resources and support to help them realize self-sufficiency.

ROOM AT THE INN is a temporary, emergency shelter program for homeless women and families. We empower program participants to create solutions to their homelessness through education, referrals and case management. We serve approx. 150-200 clients per year, including single mothers with children, single women, two-parent or single-father families. With a program capacity of 20 clients per day, we assist individuals experiencing homelessness throughout the St. Louis area. Sponsored by the Sisters of Divine Providence, since 1993, Room at the Inn is a 501(c3) non-profit.
