Dear Folks,

It's been a hectic seven weeks at St Jude, and an expensive time to boot: with purchases, bids, contracts and negotiations for planned, and some unexpected, operational costs.

The following is a list of events, in order, which took place here at St. Jude beginning the week after Easter Sunday. The last of them was completed this past week.

1. Purchasing and installing a 2-channel receiver and 2 wireless microphones in the church. (\$627.00)
2. Trimming trees and removal of dead wood fallen on the fence and over the driveway behind the school building. (\$1500.00)
3. Patching 7 areas of disintegrated driveway behind the school building (\$12,716.00)
4. Necessary replacement of one HVAC unit in the Rectory, immediately followed by the necessary replacement of the second unit. (\$12,894.00)
5. The day the second HVAC units were installed, the Rectory dryer died. Washer and Dryer (\$784.00)
6. Jetting of Rectory sewer line to the main line. (\$482.00)
7. Leaking water on the floor in the furnace room at the end of the church hallway, plus new cap to the rooftop stack. Service and repair (\$1895.00)

TOTAL: \$ 30,898.00

WOW !

We have yet to replace the lights on the outside (front and ends) of the school building. (approx \$1800.00). This fall we will be re-sealing the entire parking lot from the street to the fence behind the school building, and re-stripping the upper parking lot. (\$9199.00)

As one parishioner astutely pointed out, "We're not just a sleepy little parish, are we?"
