Room At The Inn is a temporary, emergency shelter program for homeless women and families. They empower program participants to create solutions to their homelessness through education, referrals and case management. They serve approximately 100-200 clients per year, including single mothers with children, single women, two-parent or single-father families. With a program capacity of 20 clients per day, they assist individuals experiencing homelessness throughout the St. Louis area. Sponsored by the Sisters of Divine Providence since 1993. Room at the Inn is a 501(c3) non-profit.

Wish list for Room at the Inn

Paper towels, paper plates, plastic cutlery, paper cups, bath tissue, bath towels and wash cloths, laundry detergent, cleaning solvents, liquid dish detergent, bar soap, Vaseline, hand and body lotion, mesh laundry bags, clear plastic totes, foil and plastic wrap, storage baggies (quart, gallon and 2 gallon, food storage containers (regular and microwave, trash bags (14 - 44 gallon or larger).

Men's and women's white and colored t-shirts, men's and women's sweat pants, men's and women's pajama bottoms. Listed items of clothing, medium—XXL. Men's and women's socks.

Combination locks (10), umbrellas and umbrella strollers.

Gift Cards: Aldi, Walmart and Shop-n-Save. Copy paper, bus passes, computer flash drives (new), baby monitors in good working condition.

Loaves and Fishes is a thriving food pantry and homeless shelter that provides food for over 300 people and housing for over 300 families each year. Loaves and Fishes exists to serve those who have been struck by economic hardships, providing them with resources and support to help them realize self-sufficiency.

GREATER NEEDS: Cleaning products - Lysol, Pine Sol, trash Bags (13-gallon and larger), laundry detergent and bleach, dish soap, toilet paper, paper products, utensils, cups, plates, bowls, paper towels; twin size blankets and bed linens, pillows (new), towels and wash cloths, diapers 3, 4, 5, disinfectant wipes.

PANTRY ITEMS LIST: Box cereal, kids snacks, side dishes, mac-n-cheese, chili or soups, juice pouches, potato chips, canned meats (easy to open), canned fruit (easy to open), bottled water, drink mix, jelly or jam, packs of Ramen Noodles.

AFTER SCHOOL SNACKS: Lunchables, juice boxes, gummy snacks, potato chips, granola bars, etc.

Bridge Bread products are sold through 33 churches: 11 Catholic Parishes and 22 Protestant Churches. We began offering their products at St. Jude in March 2017.

They also have 4 commercial accounts (restaurant, hotel, food truck); one institution (hospital) sales, and; two retail (shop and food truck) sales.

Bridge Bread products are sold after Mass on our Snack Saturday and Donut Sunday weekends which is the third weekend of each month. Orders are delivered for pick-up up the following weekend.

All monies collected are used to help homeless men by training them with a new skill, baking (and all that it entails from products to service), in order to help them get back on their feet with a stronger foothold.
