distributing the Precious Blood at the Eucharist.

Further, it is strongly suggested that touching

Our **ONHAWEEM COMMISSION**, to which our former Community and Service Commissions have been combined in the name of St. Jude Parish, conduct ongoing drives throughout the year to assist those among the less fortunate people in our area.

Below, you will find a brief description of the programs that we assist on an ongoing basis. The "Wish Lists" have been supplied to us by the agencies.

If you are able and would like to contribute to these collections you may do so by bringing in any of the items and placing them in the designated baskets in the Vestibule.

God bless you folks for your kindness and generosity toward serving these people and the agencies dedicated to helping them. Your gifts are truly appreciated as you continue to touch the lives of many.

**LOAVES AND FISHES** is a thriving food pantry and homeless shelter that provides food for over 300 people and housing for over 300 families each year. Loaves and Fishes exists to serve those who have been struck by economic hardships, providing them with resources and support to help them realize self-sufficiency.

**ROOM AT THE INN** is a temporary, emergency shelter program for homeless women and families.

We empower program participants to create solutions to their homelessness through education, referrals and case management. We serve approx. 150-200 clients per year, including single mothers with children, single women, two-parent or single-father families. With a program capacity of 20 clients per day, we assist individuals experiencing homelessness throughout the St. Louis area.

**Bridge Bread** is another organization that we help through our Onhaweem Commission

**We started selling Bridge Bread at St Jude in March 2017.**

Bridge Bread is sold through 33 churches. This year sales totaled \$29,966. 11 Catholic Parishes - sales and donations \$17,943.00 and 22 Protestant Churches - sales and donations \$12,022.

They also have 4 commercial accounts (restaurant, hotel, food truck) sales total \$8,570.00; one institution (hospital) sales and donations \$526.00; two retail (shop and food truck) sales and donation \$5,672.00, and three other donors have donated \$5,576.00. Total income so far this year is \$50,310.93

Bridge Bread products are sold after Mass on our Snack Saturday and Donut Sunday weekends, which is the third weekend of each month, and the orders are delivered for pick-up the following weekend.

All monies collected are used to help homeless by training them with a new skill (baking and all that it entails) in order for them to get back on their feet with a stronger foothold.
