## WISH LIST FOR BACKBACK ITEMS

The Ohnaweem Commission invites you to participate in a new Project with the St. Ann Police Department.

They have requested 27 Backpacks, 6 Children under 10, 6 Teens & 15 Homeless. There is a list of items we wish to collect to include in the Backpacks.

We hope to be able to gather these items over the next two weekends, March 21/22 and March 28/29 so we may get them to the Police Department by April 1st.

Men's and women's black or white socks (30),  
Fleece Blankets: adult = 21, teen = 6, Kids = 6.  
Adult pillows = 15, Hand Towels = 15. Cereal  
bowls and Granola Bars = 30. Gatorade, Jerky,  
and soup packages = 21. Water bottles = 24.  
Candy bars, cookies, juice boxes. Hygiene; Sani-  
tizers, deodorant, shampoo and conditioner, body  
wash, hand lotion, packages of kleenex, bar  
soap, chapstick, Advil & Tylenol, Mylar thermal  
blankets, female hygiene products, hair brushes,  
pony tail holders.

Due to the national pandemic emergency Archbishop Carlson has **mandated** the following measures.

- ◆ All Catholics are dispensed from attending Sunday the next 3 weekends (March 14/14, March 21/22, and March 28/29). Mass schedules will remain unchanged.
- ◆ All who are sick, elderly, or vulnerable due to a medical condition are urged to remain at home
- ◆ Understand that Mass schedules and parish and diocesan events may change.
- ◆ Those who attend Mass are **not** required to receive Holy Communion.
- ◆ No one is under any obligation to receive nor distribute Holy Communion
- ◆ Those who choose to temporarily refrain from receive Holy Communion can make an act of Spiritual Communion (This is done by praying to the Lord to be worthily united to the true presence of the Most Holy Eucharist).
- ◆ It is strongly urged that all parishioners receive Holy communion in the hand during the crisis.
- ◆ Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist may **ONLY** distribute in the hand. All who wish to receive on the tongue must go to the priest.
- ◆ Physical exchange of the sign of Peace is banned during the crisis (use a hand gesture or bow instead).
- ◆ Confession is only to be done through a screen, to conform to the health departments social distancing guidelines.
- ◆ Fish Fries may be canceled or their conditions altered. Check before you go.
- ◆ Parish activities may be canceled or altered during the crisis. Be alert for notifications.
- ◆ **Collections!** If you choose not to attend Mass please do not forget to mail or drop off your contributions or we will have to stop paying our bills.
- ◆ No one should come to Mass or church activities if they are sick or their immune system is compromised. It is not a sin to miss Mass when you are sick.
- ◆ All have the options to participate in the Mass on TV via channels such as EWTN.
- ◆ Anyone may request that Holy Communion be brought to their place of residence.
- ◆ Health organizations are recommending that all keep a distance of 3 feet whenever possible.
- ◆ The distributions via the chalice is suspended.
- ◆ No ordinary or extraordinary ministers should distribute Holy Communion if they have signs of illness.
- ◆ All ministers delivering Holy Communion to the sick and homebound need to be in good health and also under the age of 60.
- ◆ Holy water fonts are drained and left empty during the crisis.
