I am hopeful that we will begin to get back to our "new normal" as soon as possible while using all the safety precautions required. We are all in this together. Stay healthy, pray often. Fr. Jim

Divine Mercy Sunday (aka Second Sunday of Easter) A devotion based on the mystical journals of St. Faustina Kowalski.

The Divine Mercy Chaplet is built on using a rosary and several sacramental acts. The Chaplet performed on the designated day confers on the person who completes it "... total forgiveness of sins and the punishments due for those sins." Or course, in these days of the pandemic there are major problems this year in completing the Chaplet. But first let us outline the requirements of the devotion.

I. Actions. 1) make a sacramental confession 2) receive the Eucharist 3) say a prayer for the intention of the Pope of Divine Mercy Sunday. these actions alone without the Chaplet prayers are sufficient to acquire a plenary indulgence.

II. The Chaplet. A) Before an image of Jesus (picture or crucifix) B) Using the beads of a standard rosary say a Our Father, a Hail Mary and the Creed (offering the entire Chaplet in honor for the suffering of Jesus) C) on each of the Our Father beads pray "Eternal Father I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of your Son our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world. D) on each of the Hail Mary beads pray "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion have mercy on us and the whole world." E) At concluding the beads pray three times "Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One have mercy on us and the whole world."

With no public masses a spiritual confession and communion can be said with the Chaplet and in the present crisis this will suffice. May God protect you all and keep you safe. ~Fr. Jim
