TRIDUUM - HOLY THURSDAY, GOOD FRIDAY AND HOLY SATURDAY.

Dear Parish Family,

This weekend, with the commemoration of the Lord's triumphal entry into Jerusalem on this **PALM SUNDAY**, Holy Mother Church will remember the saving events of **HOLY WEEK**. With the Lenten Season officially ending on Wednesday, we enter into the holiest day which our Catholic Tradition has for centuries referred to as **THE TRIDUUM**.

These Sacred Rites remind us, in Word and Sacrament, of the salvation won for us by Jesus Christ. So, please take time to read this Synopsis which briefly describes the ceremonies of these most Holy days of the Church's Liturgical Year.

HOLY THURSDAY



HOLY THURSDAY 4 PM & 7 PM

On this day, we celebrate the beginning of the final events of the earthly life of Jesus. On Holy Thursday, we shall:

- Remember Jesus' institution of the Eucharist, the Sacrament by which He is truly present in our midst to continue His Saving Ministry;
- Recall the institution of the Sacred Priesthood by which He confers on men the power to offer sacrifice and forgive sin;
- Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the Chapel of Repose.

GOOD FRIDAY 3 PM & 7 PM



On this evening, we continue the Triduum as we remember the Passion and Death of Jesus. On this evening we shall:

- Solemnly proclaim the **PASSION OF THE LORD** in the communal reading from the Gospel of St. John:
- Pray for the needs of the Church, the Baptized, those seeking Baptism, non-believers, nations and governments, public officials, the poor and needy, the sick and all humanity;
- Venerate the Crucifix and proclaim Jesus as our Personal Lord and Savior;
- Receive Holy Communion and be one with Jesus, the living Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, Who died for our sins remembering that he lives in our midst daily so as to strengthen us throughout our lives.

ON GOOD FRIDAY AFTERNOON, FROM NOON UNTIL 3 PM, THREE HOURS (TRES HORES) WILL BE OBSERVED AT ST. JUDE AS TRADITION TELLS US THAT JESUS HUNG DYING ON THE CROSS

NOTE THAT THERE WILL BE NO CEREMONIES DURING THESE HOURS, BUT THAT THE CHURCH BUILDING WILL BE OPEN FOR THOSE WHO WISH TO PRAY AND MEDIATE UPON THE CRUCIFIXION OF CHRIST DURING THESE THREE HOURS.

EASTER VIGIL HOLY SATURDAY, 8:00 PM

On this Holiest of nights, we shall conclude the Triduum Ritual as we celebrate the Great Vigil of Easter and remember that Jesus rose from the dead and, by doing so overcame death and sin forever. During the Vigil we shall:

- Light the **NEW FIRE** and the **PASCHAL CANDLE**, the Symbol of the Risen Christ, and His saving grace:
- Be blessed with the **WATER**, renewing our promise of Baptism:
- Share again in the Eucharist as a Community of Faith.

EASTER SUNDAY MASSES 9:00 AM

On Easter Sunday, we shall gather as we do each Sunday to celebrate the fact that Jesus Christ is Risen from the dead. We shall come together as His People and profess to one another and the world the Good News that God loves us with an Eternal Love.
