WISDOM OF MOTHER TERESA. As we consider the wisdom of Jesus' Beatitudes, here are some pearls of wisdom from Mother Teresa called, "Love them Anyway": *People are unreasonable, illogical, and self-centered: love them anyway. If you do good, people will accuse you of selfish ulterior motives: do good anyway. If you are successful, you win false friends and true enemies: succeed anyway. The good you do will be forgotten tomorrow: do good anyway. Honesty and frankness make you vulnerable: be honest and frank anyway. What you spent years building may be destroyed overnight: build anyway. People really need help but may attack you if you help them: help people anyway. Give the world the best you have and you'll get kicked in the teeth: give the world the best you've got anyway – because in the end it is between you and God and not between you and the world anyway.*
