As Catholics, we follow these sacrificial practices during Lent: **Abstinence from meat** by all those 14 years of age and older on Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays in Lent and Good Friday. **Fasting** by all who are 18 but not yet 59 on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday: one full meal each day, with two smaller meals if needed. Solid foods between meals is not permitted.
