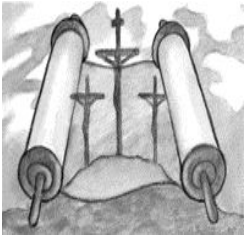

Upward Bound Program at SFU has openings for 8th, 9th, and 10th graders from Cambria County high schools. Upward Bound is a college access program that helps eligible students learn more about the college application process, prepare for the SAT's, and apply for financial aid and scholarships. From September through May, students participate in Saturday follow-ups at SFU and afterschool tutorials in their communities. Additional activities include college visits/fairs, SAT cram sessions, and FAFSA completion nights. During a six-week residential summer program, students attend classes in lab sciences, math, foreign languages, and humanities.
