People of God and Parishioners of Corpus Christi



This season of LENT has certainly been a challenge to us all; a challenge of time, of patience, of responding to the call of our faith leaders, our civil leaders and our scientists, a time to take inventory of who and how we come to live out our lives.

There is always in our Easter greetings a call to be one with the Lord but this year to take advantage of space and Reality, hoping not to be injured or to injure. We have had an opportunity to shine in the silence and to glow as we have been challenged to do alone or within six feet of those we love and care for.

This is not the norm or what we have called normal for our time but this is a different time than what we have faced in may a year. Some say we will be getting back to normal but then again our normal isn't like yesterday —in fact, maybe our normal should be like our Lent could still be about. Jesus calls us to his normal in his Lenten call — “praying more,” “fasting some” and sacrificing” to help others. Are YOU There?

The call of LENT and our response to the action of the Coronavirus Pandemic is really only about six and 1/2 weeks in length so far. There have been many hot spots in the Pandemic all around the world. NO place is exempted. We don't have the luxury of not responding to the voices of calm and science. When we see the number of people who have stood in the trenches (so to speak in war time parlance) it is our call to stand with them.

Hopefully, you might have seen the response to people in such unique tributes, whether in NYC, London, Spain or everywhere — applause, flashing spot lights, banging on pans, making signs of “YES”. Let us also join in our own tribute, thanking Jesus in our Lent whether it be in prayer or appreciation. Let Jesus, this Easter, help us to our normal; let Jesus lead us to dedicate ourselves to a “YES” that can change us and change our world.

We have been challenged to how we here celebrate the liturgies of Lent. Bishop Fabbro had suggested — reaching out to our parishioners in some way. Some of our parishes took to streaming the liturgies for TV viewing. Here at Corpus we followed Bishop Fabbro's suggestion to contact all of our parishioners using the Parish Registration List. The number of 2,384+ entrees was indeed a feat of patience. All of the staff: Fr. Christian, myself, Cyril Bagin, our custodian Pam Dagenais, our secretary Sherri Zor-zit, our Deacon Art Williams and our comptroller Daniela Pastorius, lent a hand.

For most of us, the response was heartfelt. It was a marvelous opportunity to be one with the Lord and one with all of you.

May Easter blessings and a hearty ALLELUIA be to all of you and your families. May your Easter be joyous!

FAMILY OF PARISHES

Prior to the activation of our Family of Parishes sometime in the future as laid out by the bishop, a committee was formed in September 2019 comprised of the pastors and 4 parishioners from each of the parishes involved: Our Lady of Mound Carmel, St. Phillippe and St. Ane Thanh Vietnamese Catholic Church, St. Yu Jin-Gil Korean Catholic Church and Corpus Christi. Committee, named the Development Team, has been meeting monthly; it will be followed by a Transition Team before the actual activation takes place.

Diocesan parish Development Teams have been asked to focus on 3 things:

- 1) to come together with a goal of getting to know one another better before reaching out to the broader community,*
- 2) to determine where we can begin to work together as a family,*
- 3) to discern a path that will help us as a parish to become more other-centered or mission-Oriented*

Let's all pray that this new diocesan vision for the church will be successful in bringing us closer to Christ and to each other.
