RITE OF GENERAL ABSOLUTION

- Individual and integral confession and absolution continue to be the *ordinary* way which the faithful can reconcile themselves with God and with the church unless *physical or moral impossibility excuses from this kind of confession* (see canon 960).
- Addressing the difficulty Catholic priest globally are having in hearing confessions of individual persons affected by the highly contagious coronavirus, the Note made it clear that it is acceptable for bishops to offer general sacramental absolution to groups of people as deemed necessary.
- The Apostolic Penitentiary (The Holy See) indicates that it belongs to individual bishops around the world to determine when to adapt the practice of individual confession to minimize the risk of contagion.
- This is not a case of side-stepping the ordinary form of the sacrament but of utilizing an approved form, albeit extraordinary, because the use of the ordinary form presents many complications in our current situation and entails a grave risk to the health of both confessor and penitent.
- These requirements are necessary for the *valid* reception of a general sacramental absolution:
 1. The penitent must be properly disposed;
 2. The penitent must be personally resolved to confess in due time each of the grave sins which cannot for the moment be thus confessed; and
 3. The penitent should make an act of contrition (or offer some prayer of sorrow for sin) prior to receiving general sacramental absolution. (Undoubtedly this is included in the prepared liturgical rite to be given to the priest in anticipation of their celebrating general sacramental absolution.)

FAMILY OF PARISHES

Prior to the activation of our Family of Parishes sometime in the future as laid out by the bishop, a committee was formed in September 2019 comprised of the pastors and 4 parishioners from each of the parishes involved: Our Lady of Mound Carmel, St. Phillippe and St. Ane Thanh Vietnamese Catholic Church, St. Yu Jin-Gil Korean Catholic Church and Corpus Christi. Committee, named the Development Team, has been meeting monthly; it will be followed by a Transition Team before the actual activation takes place.

Diocesan parish Development Teams have been asked to focus on 3 things:

- 1) to come together with a goal of getting to know one another better before reaching out to the broader community,*
- 2) to determine where we can begin to work together as a family,*
- 3) to discern a path that will help us as a parish to become more other-centered or mission-Oriented*

Let's all pray that this new diocesan vision for the church will be successful in bringing us closer to Christ and to each other.
