You will not be permitted to leave Mass early.

Communion

You will be directed forward by an Usher. You **MUST** receive Holy Communion in the hand!

Mass Departure

You will be dismissed row by row, starting at the back. Please maintain a 6 foot distance from others and depart using the doors indicated.

FAMILY OF PARISHES

Prior to the activation of our Family of Parishes sometime in the future as laid out by the bishop, a committee was formed in September 2019 comprised of the pastors and 4 parishioners from each of the parishes involved: Our Lady of Mount Carmel, St. Phillippe and St. Ane Thanh Vietnamese Catholic Church, St. Yu Jin-Gil Korean Catholic Church and Corpus Christi. Committee, named the Development Team, has been meeting monthly; it will be followed by a Transition Team before the actual activation takes place. Diocesan parish Development Teams have been asked to focus on 3 things:

- 1) to come together with a goal of getting to know one another better before reaching out to the broader community,
 - 2) to determine where we can begin to work together as a family,
 - 3) to discern a path that will help us as a parish to become more other-centered or mission-Oriented
- Let's all pray that this new diocesan vision for the church will be successful in bringing us closer to Christ and to each other.

Individual Confession during the re-opening will normally be on

Tuesdays after the 8:30 AM Mass (until no one is waiting) and again at 7:00 PM (until no one is waiting).

The individual reception of Confession will be celebrated in the Christ the King Chapel

(which has been closed during the re-opening).

Lining up for confession will be in the foyer of the Church.

Society of St. Vincent de Paul Update

Like everyone else, our SSVP has had to adapt.

In March, we made 38 home visits, serving 55 adults and 61 kids. As Covid-19 spread, we researched what services were available. A drive through food bank opened on the west side and two organizations offered home delivery. Our members decided that we would discontinue regular visits, while offering service for emergency calls. In April, we started calling families, asking how they were doing and giving the list of food banks and services available. It was surprising to hear that most people said they were fine and did not need anything but we suggested they call us if there were any problems. For some people, we spoke much longer than we would have at the home and they were all grateful that we cared enough to call.

We also tried to solve whatever problems they faces. For example, one lady needed a bike for her son who had just started a job at a grocery store. After making some calls, we ended up with a post on the church Facebook page. Within an hour, we had the donation of a new bike, which was picked up and delivered. Some needed several calls, navigating through different agencies.

There was also a large food donation to Holy Name of Mary and the Caring Hearts Food Bank. There were 44 phone visits and 5 home visits, helping 49 adults and 55 kids. To be continued...
