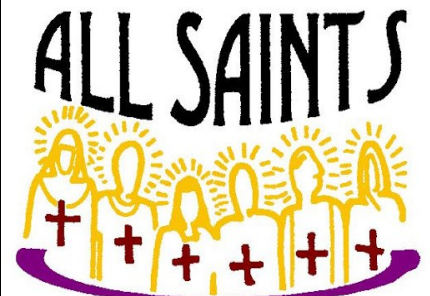

You will be dismissed row by row, starting at the back. Please maintain a 6 foot distance from others and depart using the doors indicated.

All Saints' Day

All Saints' Day is a solemn holy day of the Catholic Church celebrated annually on November 1st. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who attained heaven. It should not be confused with All Soul's Day, which is observed on November 2, and is dedicated to those who have died and not yet reached heaven. Although millions, or even billions of people may already be saints, All Saints' Day observances tend to focus on known saints--that is those recognized in the canon of the saints by the Catholic Church.

All Saints' Day is also commemorated by members of the Eastern Orthodox Church as well as some protestant churches, such as Lutheran and Anglican churches. Generally, All Saints' Day is a Catholic Holy Day of Obligation, meaning all Catholics are required to attend Mass on that day, unless they have an excellent excuse, such as serious illness.

Other countries have different rules according to their national bishop's conferences. The bishops of each conference have the authority to amend the rules surrounding the obligation of the day.

St. Vincent de Paul

May was a quieter month with 14 visits, bringing food and money to help 16 adults and 11 kids. We found that single people were the most disadvantaged and needed supplemental help, including produce, cab fare and coordination with other agencies.

June brought 22 visits, helping 29 adults and 27 kids. One family living in a motel, had suffered a fire, were in need of food, clothing and essential items. Specific problems need communications with other groups. July numbers increased to 33 visits. We had 2 new families, one having 8 members, in need of furniture. In addition to food and vouchers, there were many phone calls and times spent trying to get furniture donations and arranging delivery. We were able to help one person with money for shoes and a haircut when he secured a job, after 3 years of hardship and illness.

August had 9 visits, with more work on finding household goods, furniture and arranging deliveries. September was up to 24 visits, helping 28 adults and 30 kids. There were 3 new families, one of which had 7 members including a sick child, moving in with nothing. Again, there was a lot of problem solving and searching for donations to furnish a home. Appliances are impossible to find, a Facebook search secured a stove, washer, TV and other goods. We paid for deliveries.

*As you can see, our work continues and we appreciate all the support you have been giving us. Our store on King St. is open for clothing donations and the store at 1245 Lauzon is accepting everything. If you have any questions, call **Pauline at 519-966-8421.***

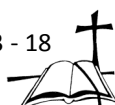
