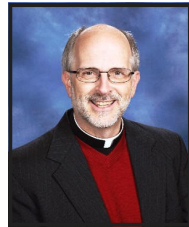

From Tricia Tetzlaff, our Pastoral Associate for Music Ministry:

I want to start by thanking you all for the overwhelmingly kind welcome I have received from St. Catherine. I am so thankful to be leading music at such a loving and vibrant faith community. I would like to share with you a little about my background and how it has molded me into who I am now, as a disciple of Jesus, as well as how I would like St. Catherine to view music in worship. I went to college to be an opera singer. That was my dream for as long as I can remember. If you gave me a stage and a spotlight, I was happy. By the time I was about to finish my undergraduate degree in vocal performance, however, I started questioning that dream. It felt increasingly empty to stand on a stage and be lauded. I decided to pursue post graduate work in music therapy so that I could use music to help people with disabilities and chronic sickness. No spotlight, no stage, just being the hands and feet (and voice) of Jesus to the least of these. God opened doors for me in my 30s that made it clear He wanted me to be involved in music ministry, and that's how I ended up directing music at St. Catherine. We encounter God in many different ways, and beauty is one way to encounter Him. Because music ministry is a way to pray, my intention is that the beauty of the music that we all sing leads us into prayer and praise for the gift of God in our lives. The stage and spotlight are His and His alone. Please join me in mindfully approaching musical worship prayerfully, entering the presence of God with gratitude and reverence.

Reflections on Personal Holiness by Pope Francis (5)

Pope Francis doesn't think that the call to holiness should be a burden; rather, it "should excite and encourage us to give our all and to embrace that unique plan that God willed for each of us from eternity." Just as it was for Jeremiah, so it is true for us: "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you." (Jeremiah 1:5) To be holy mean we have to be a priest or sister. He warns of the false idea that holiness means we have to go away and pray a lot – that's not true! "We are all called to be holy by living our lives with love and by bearing witness in everything we do, wherever we find ourselves. Are you called to the consecrated life? Be holy by living out your commitment with joy. Are you married? Be holy by loving and caring for your husband or wife, as Christ does for the Church. Do you work for a living? Be holy by laboring with integrity and skill in the service of your brothers and sisters. Are you a parent or grandparent? Be holy by patiently teaching the little ones how to follow Jesus. Are you in a position of authority? Be holy by working for the common good and renouncing personal gain. (para. 13, 14 in *Gaudete et Exultate*) **What are the situations in your life where God is calling you to be holy?**
