## Parish

Last weekend Deacon Dave's homily pointed out that as we look over our 160 year history, the foundation of this parish is more than the names of priests and religious and some prominent people. It is all the great people and ethnic groups whose names we don't know that are our foundation. It is the many people over the last 160 years, whose lives of devotion and faith as husbands and wives, single people, mothers and fathers and children, aunts and uncles and grandparents working together who are our foundation. They did these things quietly and consistently, with great sacrifice and great devotion. Were they perfect? No, but it is because they shared the same beliefs and tried to live as disciples that we are able to gather this morning as people of faith continuing to build on the foundation.

Today is Trinity Sunday, and as we look around our church we see much diversity. We know that at Pentecost, God's Spirit rested on everyone gathered and continues to rest on those who gather. Pope Francis recently said that there are two obstacles facing every Spirit led community. The first being diversity without unity. This happens when we want to separate, take sides, and form parties, when we adopt airtight positions, when we become locked into our own ideas and ways of doing things. When this happens, we choose the part over the whole, belonging to a group rather than the Church. The second obstacle is seeking unity without diversity. Here unity becomes uniformity where everyone must do everything together and alike. St. Paul says, "where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. (2Cor 3:17) One doesn't have to look very far to see this polarization -one against the other. Since "those others" have nothing of value to say, we stop listening, stop communicating. In this environment, compromise is viewed as weakness, and community impossible. This unity without diversity brings us to violence. On this Feast of the Holy Trinity, pray to the Holy Spirit, to bring us all together as One.

Summer vacation! Special thanks goes to Clive Phinn and the choir for leading us in song week after week. The choir will be taking a summer vacation from singing, not a vacation from Church. They will be coming back the first Sunday of September. They still are looking for new members. Thank you again.

Tomorrow is Memorial Day. We will be having a 10:00 o'clock mass here with the Chicago Fire Department; all are invited.


