**POPE FRANCIS TO CANONIZE
POPE PAUL VI AND
OSCAR ROMERO**

Today, October 14, Pope Francis will celebrate the canonization of Pope Paul VI, who oversaw much of the Second Vatican Council and is remembered for his 1968 Encyclical on human life, *Humanae Vitae*. Pope Francis will also canonize Oscar Romero, Archbishop of San Salvador. He spoke out against poverty, social injustice, assassinations, and torture. In 1980, Romero was assassinated while offering Mass in the chapel of the Hospital of Divine Providence.
