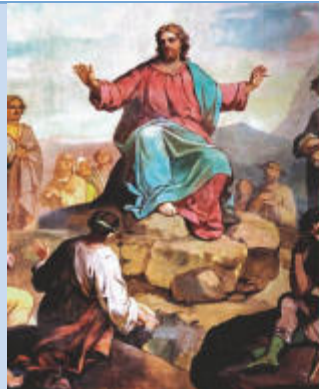

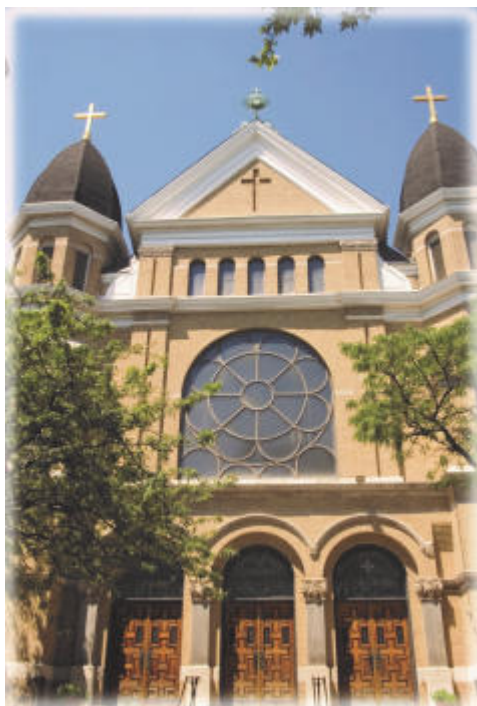

From the desk of the pastor Del escritorio del pastor

The defining moments of the holy family of Jesus, Mary, and St. Joseph are expressed to us only in the gospels of St. Matthew and St. Luke, the evangelists who wrote the Christmas Story. The sacred scripture proclaimed during Advent and Christmas at Sunday Mass invited us to accompany Mary and St. Joseph in a soul-changing journey. We allowed our ancient stories with their familiar scenes, signs, and symbols to lead us more deeply into our new identity as one parish. Our Blessed Mother and her most chaste spouse were both our models and our intercessors.

Liturgically speaking, our Advent/Christmas journey ended last week with the feast of the Presentation of Our Lord. Mary carried Jesus, The Light of the World, in her womb for nine months. With Joseph at her side, Jesus was born in Bethlehem as a gift for the entire world. The holy family entered the temple so the Christ Child could be “presented” and his mother “purified” according to the Law. Simeon and Anna waited a lifetime for God’s promise to be fulfilled and they rejoiced as they embraced baby Jesus, celebrating that God was true to his word. The holy family returns to Nazareth where Jesus will grow and mature before beginning his mission. The “Light of Truth” is no longer confined to religious rite within the temple building. Jesus, the son of God, is with us.

A decree made us a new parish last July. We’ve been challenged as local, ordinary Catholics in ways that most of us never expected nor asked for, to continue our mission to proclaim the truth of Jesus. We will need to go beyond our comfort zone and ready ourselves for the joyous work of evangelization. Like Jesus, Mary, and St. Joseph who left the temple after Presentation, we leave the previous structure of our parish so the Light of Christ can be shared with our community in new ways. In order to move beyond a mere decree, we will take the following steps in the next weeks and months to give our parish a solid base to share our Baptismal faith. In today’s bulletin, I will share only the immediate changes necessary to be in compliance with the Cardinal’s decree within our Arch diocesan’s “Renew My Church” mandate. Our true challenge and joy are in how we discover the new ways in which we will share our beautiful faith.

I find great peace and strength when I allow myself to frame our pastoral work within the example of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. They said, “Yes” to God, and became willing to share the light of Jesus with the world. We continue on a similar journey. We ask them, humbly and happily, to pray for us, the Catholic community of Holy Family/Notre Dame de Chicago.

Sunday Mass Schedule During Lent and Holy Week

The alternating schedules of the 10am Eucharist adopted the first week of Advent 2019 will continue until Palm Sunday, April 5, 2020. Holy Thursday’s Mass of the Lord’s Supper will be celebrated at the Holy Family site. After mass, we will process to the Notre Dame de Chicago site with the Blessed Sacrament where our Lord will be placed in solemn repose. Good Friday and the Lord’s Passion along with the Easter Vigil will be celebrated at the Notre Dame de Chicago site.

Easter Sunday

There will be two (2) Eucharistic celebrations at each of our parish’s sites. Both will happen in the mid-morning hours: 9:00 am at the Holy Family site and 11:00 am at the Notre Dame de Chicago site.

There will be no evening mass on Easter Sunday.

April 12, 2020, Second Sunday of Easter. New Sunday Mass Schedule for our parish.

All Masses to be celebrated at the Notre Dame de Chicago site only.

Saturday Anticipatory Mass for Sunday 5:00 pm

Sunday Morning Mass: 9:00 am and **11:00 am ***

Sunday Evening Eucharistic Celebration- 6:00pm

Wedding Masses already scheduled at the Holy Family site will continue to be celebrated. Our parish is responsible for all planned weddings there until June 30, 2020. All marriage requests from July 1, 2020, onward will be scheduled through the Jesuit Community and St. Ignatius Preparatory High School.

Towards Pentecost...May 31, 2020

I’m confident that our new Sunday Mass schedule will free us to complete other necessary tasks by the Feast of Pentecost. We are in the second half of our first year as a newly created parish. The list of tasks that need to be completed to fulfill the decree are many. The work includes preparing a budget for Fiscal Year 2020-21, begin a formal search for the parish’s director of Liturgical Music, and Adult Lifelong Formation Coordinator, to name a few. The exact relationship between our new parish and our parish school (Children of Peace) remains in flux, and continue unifying the parish business and communications offices.

Another crucial discernment is that of our parish’s new name. We will enter into dialogue using the Archdiocesan guidelines and suggestions to best engage in this process. While no decision has been made and any decision will be made together as a parish, I would like to ask you to consider “Our Lady of the Holy Family” as a potential candidate for our new name. Please bring this responsibility into your prayers.

Lastly, I need to explain the asterisk by the 11:00 am mass time above. What will the future of our mass celebrated in the Spanish language look like in our near future? Ours is no longer a community that welcomes a considerable number of monolingual Catholics from Spanish speaking countries. We have growing numbers of second and third-generation Latinos, whose primary language is English. How we celebrate our faith, especially within the context of the Eucharist, is massively important. Our journey entails more than a schedule change; it demands a conversion of heart and mind. Together we will discern how the Holy Spirit is leading us in this area of concern.

Los momentos decisivos de la sagrada familia de Jesús, María y San José se expresan sólo en los evangelios de San Mateo y San Lucas, los evangelistas que escribieron la historia de la Navidad. Las sagradas escrituras proclamadas durante el Adviento y la Navidad en la misa dominical nos invitaban a acompañar a María y San José en un viaje que cambiaba el alma. Permitimos que nuestras antiguas historias con sus escenas familiares, signos y símbolos nos llevaran más profundamente a nuestra nueva identidad como una parroquia. Nuestra Santa Madre y su más casta esposa fueron nuestros modelos e intercesores. Litúrgicamente hablando, nuestro viaje de Adviento/Navidad terminó la semana pasada con la fiesta de la Presentación de Nuestro Señor. María llevó a Jesús, la luz del mundo, en su vientre durante nueve meses. Con José a su lado, Jesús nació en Belén como un regalo para el mundo entero. La Sagrada Familia entró en el templo para que el Niño Jesús fuera "presentado" y su madre "purificada" según la Ley. Simeón y Ana esperaron toda una vida para que la promesa de Dios se cumpliera y se regocijaron mientras abrazaban al niño Jesús, celebrando que Dios era fiel a su palabra. La sagrada familia regresa a Nazaret donde Jesús crecerá y madurará antes de comenzar su misión. La "Luz de la Verdad" ya no está confinada al rito religioso dentro del edificio del templo. Jesús, el hijo de Dios, está con nosotros.

Un decreto nos hizo una nueva parroquia el pasado julio. Hemos sido desafiados como católicos locales y ordinarios de una manera que la mayoría de nosotros nunca esperó ni pidió, para continuar nuestra misión de proclamar la verdad de Jesús. Necesitaremos ir más allá de nuestra zona de confort y prepararnos para el alegre trabajo de evangelización. Como Jesús, María y San José que dejaron el templo después de la Presentación, dejamos la estructura anterior de nuestra parroquia para que la Luz de Cristo pueda ser compartida con nuestra comunidad de nuevas maneras. Para ir más allá de un mero decreto, daremos los siguientes pasos en las próximas semanas y meses para dar a nuestra parroquia una base sólida para compartir nuestra fe bautismal. En el boletín de hoy, compartiré sólo los cambios inmediatos necesarios para cumplir con el decreto del Cardenal dentro del mandato de nuestra Arquidiócesis de "Renovar mi Iglesia". Nuestro verdadero desafío y alegría está en cómo descubrimos las nuevas formas en que compartiremos nuestra hermosa fe.

Encuentro gran paz y fuerza cuando me permito enmarcar nuestra labor pastoral en el ejemplo de Jesús, María y José. Ellos dijeron "Sí" a Dios, y se mostraron dispuestos a compartir la luz de Jesús con el mundo. Continuamos en un viaje similar. Les pedimos, humilde y felizmente, que recen por nosotros, la comunidad católica de la Sagrada Familia/Notre Dame de Chicago.

Horario de la misa dominical durante la Cuaresma y la Semana Santa

Los horarios alternos de la Eucaristía de las 10am adoptados en la primera semana de Adviento de 2019 continuarán hasta el Domingo de Ramos, 5 de abril de 2020. La Misa de Jueves Santo de la Cena del Señor se celebrará en el sitio de la Sagrada Familia. Después de la misa, nos dirigiremos al sitio de Notre Dame de Chicago con el Santísimo Sacramento donde nuestro Señor será puesto en solemne reposo. El Viernes Santo y la Pasión del Señor junto con la Vigilia Pascual se celebrarán en el sitio de Notre Dame de Chicago.

Domingo de Pascua

Habrará dos (2) celebraciones eucarísticas en cada uno de los sitios de nuestra parroquia. Ambas tendrán lugar a media mañana: 9:00 am en el sitio de la Sagrada Familia y 11:00 am en el sitio de Notre Dame de Chicago. No habrá misa nocturna el domingo de Pascua.

El 12 de abril de 2020, segundo domingo de Pascua. Nuevo horario de misas dominicales para nuestra parroquia. Todas las misas se celebrarán sólo en el sitio de Notre Dame de Chicago.

Misa anticipada del sábado para el domingo 5:00 pm

Celebración Eucarística del domingo por la tarde - 6:00pm
Las misas de boda ya programadas en el sitio de la Sagrada Familia seguirán celebrándose. Nuestra parroquia es responsable de todas las bodas programadas allí hasta el 30 de junio de 2020. Todas las solicitudes de matrimonio a partir del 1 de julio de 2020 se programarán a través de la comunidad jesuita y la escuela preparatoria San Ignacio.

Hacia Pentecostés....31 de mayo de 2020

Confío en que nuestro nuevo horario de misa dominical nos liberará para completar otras tareas necesarias para la fiesta de Pentecostés.

Estamos en la segunda mitad de nuestro primer año como una parroquia recién creada. La lista de tareas que deben ser completadas para cumplir el decreto son muchas. El trabajo incluye la preparación de un presupuesto para el año fiscal 2020-21, comenzar una búsqueda formal para el director de la parroquia de Música Litúrgica, y el Coordinador de Formación para toda la vida de adultos, por nombrar algunos. La relación exacta entre nuestra nueva parroquia y nuestra escuela parroquial (Niños de la Paz) permanece en flujo, y continúa unificando las oficinas de negocios y comunicaciones de la parroquia.

Otro discernimiento crucial es el del nuevo nombre de nuestra parroquia. Entraremos en diálogo usando las pautas y sugerencias de la Arquidiócesis para participar mejor en este proceso. Aunque no se ha tomado ninguna decisión y cualquier decisión se tomará conjuntamente como parroquia, me gustaría pedirles que consideren a "Nuestra Señora de la Sagrada Familia" como un candidato potencial para nuestro nuevo nombre. Por favor, lleven esta responsabilidad a sus oraciones.

Por último, necesito explicar el asterisco para la misa de las 11:00 am de arriba. ¿Cómo será el futuro de nuestra misa celebrada en español en un futuro próximo? La nuestra ya no es una comunidad que acoge a un número considerable de católicos monolingües de países de habla hispana. Tenemos un número creciente de latinos de segunda y tercera generación, cuyo idioma principal es el inglés. La forma en que celebramos nuestra fe, especialmente en el contexto de la Eucaristía, es muy importante. Nuestro viaje implica más que un cambio de horario; exige una conversión del corazón y la mente. Juntos discerniremos cómo el Espíritu Santo nos está guiando en esta área de preocupación.

receiving Sacred Orders and should contact the pastor or the Cardinal with such information as soon as possible if there is a serious question about the candidate's suitability for ordained ministry.
