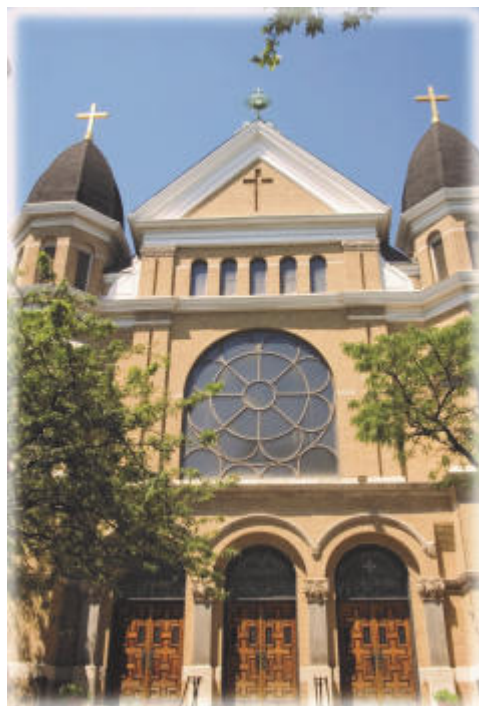

A good rule to apply when studying and praying with Sacred Scripture was drilled into my skull by a particularly intense bible professor during seminary. I remember well his regular directive, “Anytime some one’s name is mentioned in the Bible, pay attention! God will call people by name, change their name, and will sometimes use no one’s name at all. Jesus did the same thing. Pay Attention! Something extraordinary is about to happen in that story!” He was right. Names and naming are hugely important.

As we heard proclaimed last Sunday, God called Abram into a covenant, and after accepting the almighty’s invitation, our father in faith became Abraham, and his wife Sarai became Sarah. Moses was called by name, and he even dared to ask God his name. All the prophets were called by name too. The angel Gabriel was on a first-name basis with our Blessed Mother and St. Joseph was no stranger to God either. Jesus called each of His Apostles by name and even gave Simon, son of Jonah, the title “Cephas” (which is Peter or Rock). Our Lord knew Zaccheus, the Tax Collector, Bartimaeus, the Blind Man, Mary of Magdala, and Jairus.

We need to pay attention as well to the people we meet in scripture whose names we do not know. The ten lepers cleansed, the woman at the well, the rich young man, and so many others without formal names are well known to us. Jesus knew the Evil One and his many demons too, but the trickery of the “legion” of aliases was no match for our Lord. Some scholars suggest that their particular name doesn’t matter because we can so readily identify with them; suffering, struggling souls in need of Jesus love, mercy, healing, and understanding.

All this comes to mind as we ready ourselves as a newly created parish to discern our name. It is my hope and goal that we will be able to present to our Cardinal Archbishop, Blase Cupich, by the end of April. How will we be known? With what name will we give ourselves and our faith to the community? Under whose intercession will we be guided as we journey to be vital, vibrant disciples of Christ?

In the next two weeks we will name a group of parishioners as a committee to lead us through the formal process and to make sure that the discernment is done respectfully and with dignity. We will publish the criteria for naming a new parish in our bulletin and

parish website as well the process we will use to come to a final decision. Basically, the name we submit for approval must follow these parameters: the name of the Trinity, or a name for Christ, invoked in the liturgy, or a mystery of his life, or the name of the Holy Spirit, or a name for Mary, invoked under a title for her used in the liturgy, or the name of a holy angel, or the name of a canonized saint, as it appears in the Roman martyrology, or the name of a blessed provided the Apostolic See has given its permission.

The Archdiocese also needs to be prudent and practical in accepting any new parish name. Long beloved and newly minted Saints are popular for a reason, but a diocese can only have so many St Francis of Assisi or Our Lady of Guadalupe! We will continue to open ourselves to the movement of the Holy Spirit during this process, and She will lead us to where we need to be.

When I announced our new Sunday Mass schedule, I did make a suggestion for a name for our newly created parish, *Our Lady of the Holy Family*. I think this title embraces our shared history and identity. It is not an awkward hyphenated name and is wonderfully celebrated the Sunday after Christmas. I know that many of our parishioners have beautiful ideas that deserve our prayerful consideration. Allow me to offer some suggestions to prime the pump, so to speak. *St. Francis Xavier Cabrini (St. Mother Cabrini), St. Damien, Venerable Augustus Tolton.*

Bring our parish discernment into your Lenten prayer and listen to your heart. The Holy Spirit can usually be found there. What would you suggest? Perhaps the links below will be of help.

Una buena regla para aplicar cuando se estudia y reza con la Sagrada Escritura fue perforada en mi cráneo por un profesor de Biblia particularmente intenso durante el seminario. Recuerdo bien su directiva habitual: "Cuando se menciona el nombre de alguien en la Biblia, ¡atención! Dios llamará a las personas por su nombre, les cambiará el nombre, y a veces no usará el nombre de nadie. Jesús hizo lo mismo. ¡Presta atención! ¡Algo extraordinario está a punto de suceder en esa historia!" Tenía razón. Los nombres y los nombres son muy importantes.

Como oímos proclamar el domingo pasado, Dios llamó a Abram a un pacto, y después de aceptar la invitación del todopoderoso, nuestro padre en la fe se convirtió en Abraham, y su esposa Sarai se convirtió en Sara. Moisés fue llamado por su nombre, e incluso se atrevió a preguntarle a Dios su nombre. Todos los profetas fueron llamados por su nombre también. El ángel Gabriel se llamaba por su nombre de pila con nuestra Madre Bendita y San José tampoco era un extraño para Dios. Jesús llamó a cada uno de sus Apóstoles por su nombre e incluso le dio a Simón, hijo de Jonás, el título de "Cefas" (que es Pedro o Roca). Nuestro Señor conoció a Zaqueo, el recaudador de impuestos, Bartimeo, el ciego, María de Magdala y Jairo.

Debemos prestar atención también a la gente que encontramos en las escrituras cuyos nombres no conocemos. Los diez leprosos limpiados, la mujer del pozo, el joven rico, y tantos otros sin nombres formales son bien conocidos por nosotros. Jesús conocía al Maligno y a sus muchos demonios también, pero el engaño de la "legión" de alias no era rival para nuestro Señor. Algunos eruditos sugieren que su nombre particular no importa porque podemos identificarnos fácilmente con ellos; almas sufrientes y luchadoras que necesitan el amor, la misericordia, la curación y la comprensión de Jesús.

Todo esto nos viene a la mente cuando nos preparamos como una parroquia recién creada para discernir nuestro nombre. Es mi esperanza y mi meta que podamos presentar a nuestro Cardenal Arzobispo, Blase Cupich, a finales de abril. ¿Cómo seremos conocidos? ¿Con qué nombre nos daremos a nosotros mismos y a nuestra fe a la comunidad? ¿Bajo la intercesión de quién seremos guiados en nuestro camino a ser discípulos vitales y vibrantes de Cristo?

En las próximas dos semanas nombraremos a un grupo de feligreses como comité para que nos guíe a través del proceso formal y se asegure que el discernimiento se haga con respeto y dignidad. Publicaremos los criterios

para nombrar una nueva parroquia en nuestro boletín y en el sitio web de la parroquia, así como el proceso que usaremos para llegar a una decisión final. Básicamente, el nombre que sometamos a aprobación debe seguir estos parámetros: el nombre de la Trinidad, o un nombre para Cristo, invocado en la liturgia, o un misterio de su vida, o el nombre del Espíritu Santo, o un nombre para María, invocado bajo un título para ella usado en la liturgia, o el nombre de un santo ángel, o el nombre de un santo canonizado, como aparece en el martirologio romano, o el nombre de un beato, siempre que la Sede Apostólica haya dado su permiso.

La Arquidiócesis también debe ser prudente y práctica en la aceptación de cualquier nuevo nombre de parroquia. Los santos recién acuñados son populares por una razón, pero una diócesis no puede tener tantos San Francisco de Asís o Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe. Continuaremos abriéndonos al movimiento del Espíritu Santo durante este proceso, y Ella nos llevará a donde necesitamos estar.

Cuando anuncié nuestro nuevo horario de misa dominical, sugerí un nombre para nuestra recién creada parroquia, *Nuestra Señora de la Sagrada Familia*. Creo que este título abarca nuestra historia e identidad compartida. No es un nombre con guión y se celebra maravillosamente el domingo después de Navidad. Sé que muchos de nuestros feligreses tienen bellas ideas que merecen nuestra consideración en la oración. Permítanme ofrecerles algunas sugerencias para preparar la bomba, por así decirlo. *Santa Francisca Javier Cabrini (Santa Madre Cabrini), San Damián, Venerable Augusto Tolton*.

Lleve nuestro discernimiento parroquial a su oración de Cuaresma y escuche su corazón. El Espíritu Santo se encuentra generalmente allí. ¿Qué sugiere? Tal vez los enlaces de abajo sean de ayuda.
