Notes from Father Tom...

The first week of Masses in church with people attending went fine. Weekend Masses had the following attendance: Saturday 4pm 62, Sunday 8 am 65, Sunday 10 am 56 and Sunday noon 43, for a total of 226. Monday I had a Zoom meeting with about 10 pastors and nine of them had similar attendance. One did not yet have public Masses. There were very few children here. Many of the people who did attend were people who are at risk at least because of their age.

We will set the schedule for Masses according to need. The difficulty is getting the word out to those who are not on the internet. We may need to change it as we go but the schedule for June 13/14 will be: Sat 4 and Sunday 9 and 11. Weekdays Wednesday 7pm and Thursday 9am. We will stream Masses Saturday at 4, Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday at 9am and Wednesday at 7pm I also will hear confessions Saturday from 2-2:30 in the daily Mass chapel. I still cannot use the confessionals yet but we will have chairs set so you can go behind a screen or face to face. Please wait outside the chapel until the person in front of you exits. That starts on the 13th.

In coming weeks we will have columns in the bulletin from other staff members. For Cameron and Sister Denise Marie the columns can be more introductory. For the rest of us, we will be writing on whatever.

This week is Trinity Sunday and next Sunday is Corpus Christi, two important days in the life of the Church.

Please pray for an end to racial inequality. Even though legislators may pass laws, equality is primarily of the heart. It is seeing all people as brothers and sisters and treating them as if they were the Lord. The teachings of Jesus are rich in showing us how to do this. The Great Commandment is not bad for starters. More on this next week.

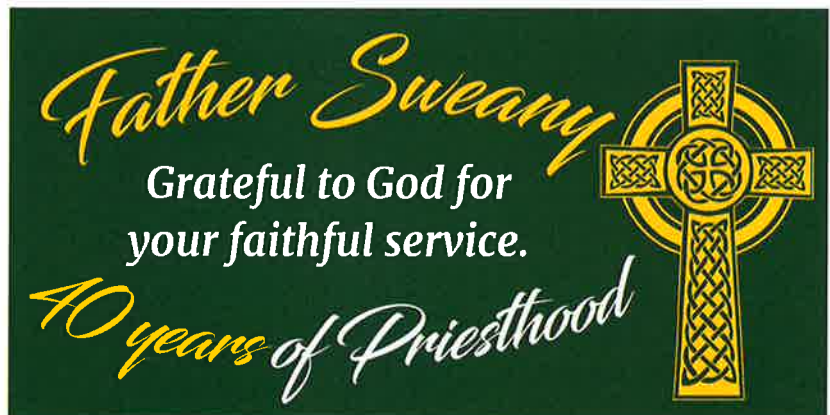

Saint Bernadette Soubirous (1844-1879)

April 16

With Immaculate Mary's "Ave Maria" for its refrain, Andy Williams' "Village of Saint Bernadette" peaked at #7 on Billboard's Top 40 at Christmas 1959, airing on radio stations all over America. Imagine! April 16 marks the feast of Bernadette Soubirous, the teenager who, combing a refuse heap for firewood, saw a "beautiful lady" who identified herself in words Bernadette faithfully reported to the bishop, though she did not understand their meaning: "I am the Immaculate Conception." Relentlessly interrogated, she never wavered in her story or sweetness. Chronically ill all her life and dead at thirty-five, Bernadette left behind the shrine at Lourdes where healing waters still flow from the spring that her "beautiful lady" pointed out to her. —Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. The Most Holy Trinity

Throughout the liturgical cycle of Sundays and seasons, there are certain days that invite us to focus on particular aspects of our faith. Today is such a day, when we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. On this Sunday after Pentecost, we reflect on the mystery of our Triune God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. From the moment of creation, through the encounter of Moses with God on the mountain, through Christ's life, death, and resurrection, with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, our understanding and appreciation of God's very life has unfolded and deepened. Jesus came into the world to make God's life and love known, the love of God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, the love of God that brings us peace.

God Is Merciful And Gracious

At moments in our lives we may wonder how we know who God is or what God is like. Today's readings help us to feel secure in placing our faith in God and being assured of God's unfailing love. When Moses went up the mountain as the Lord had commanded him, God powerfully described himself, "The Lord, the Lord, a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity." Jesus shows us the depths of this life of God. He came not to condemn the world but to save it. As people in relationship with God, we often fail. We walk away from God's ways, fall into sinfulness, and then, with the Lord's grace, come to our senses and return. God's words to Moses and the very life of Jesus show us that when we do so, we can still rely on God's mercy and kindness, because love is God's very nature.

Called To Be Like God

We might consider this testimony to the life and love of God and think to ourselves, so what? Knowing that God loves us is reassuring, and may help us place our faith and trust in the Lord, but something more naturally follows—as followers of Jesus, we are called to become more like him. When others look at us, they should be able to say that we are "merciful and gracious, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity." This gets at the heart of what it means to be a Christian. Our daily decisions, words, and actions are to reflect the merciful graciousness of God. We are able to do this through the indwelling power and presence of the Holy Spirit. In what ways are you becoming more Christ-like? May the grace of the Lord, love of God, and fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you as you renew your commitment to show and share God's kindness to others!

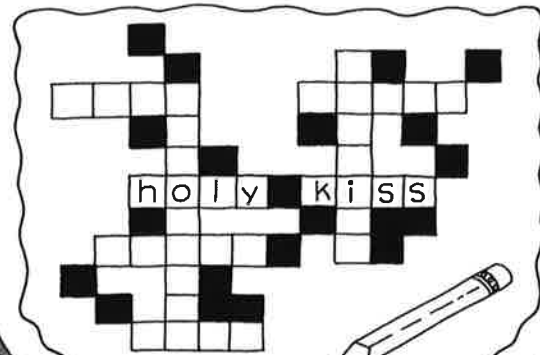
