The Area

On its way to becoming a world-class city, Wilmington is “in the middle of it all.” Actually, it’s the midway point between New York and Washington, DC. Wilmington is the largest city in Delaware and its roots were established on the site of Fort Christina - the first Swedish settlement in North America. Downtown is dotted with historical attractions, including Old Swedes Church, erected in 1698 and still in use, and Willingtown Square, where several of Wilmington’s oldest residential structures have been relocated and reconstructed.

The Christina and Brandywine River merge in Wilmington just shy of where they flow into the Delaware River (yes, of General George Washington’s fame). Art, history, gentile living, and fast-paced progress all collide in Wilmington and the Brandywine Valley.
