MASS INTENTIONS

Weekend Masses have been rescheduled that were scheduled during the Covid 19 crisis to summer and fall dates that were open for the time slot previously requested. Please watch the bulletin for your rescheduled Mass or call the rectory to get the date it has been rescheduled to.

PEOPLE ARRIVING AT CHURCH:
MASKS ARE REQUIRED!

Bring your mask to Church every time you come. To help you maintain social distancing, every other pew will be closed off. No collection will be taken up by ushers, but baskets will be placed for you to drop your envelope of donation as you leave.

Please do not jam up the doorways as you leave but enter and exit quickly.

For Holy Communion you may remove your masks as Deacon Jim and Fr. Fran will be masked for communion. We ask that you come for Communion one pew at a time respecting the six-foot markings on the floor.

Choirs will not be restored now but will be phased in over time as the restriction from hymnals and missalettes is lifted. We will sing only the Proper parts of the Mass.

The offertory procession is lifted. If you have a Mass booked for a loved one you will NOT be presenting the gifts. If you are a server, reader, or Minister of the Eucharist your ministries will be phased in over time.

For now, only Deacon Jim, Fr. Fran and a reader will be in the sanctuary. This is so Deacon and Fr. Fran will not have to be masked during Mass but only at Communion.

As before, there will be no sign of peace so that contact is avoided. At the beginning and end of Mass there will be no procession thru the congregation, but they will enter and leave by the shortest route.

This situation is not ideal. Please do not focus on what we cannot do but rather on what we can do. We now can gather for worship, be enlightened by the Word of God, and receive the Eucharist. Is that not all we want and need? All these measures are for our safety and will be tweaked as we move forward. Many of these restrictions will be lifted over time as we come closer to our “new normal”.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Volunteers are needed to wipe down pews and surfaces after each Mass on the weekends. Simply stay behind after Mass and see Father Fran for instructions.

CHURCH RESTRICTIONS

Restrictions on the size of the community are in place to allow only 40% of maximum capacity. Our maximum as stated on the occupancy permit is 288. Each Mass then can only seat 112 persons. A thorough sanitizing of the church has taken place and the church will be cleaned again after each service. Volunteers will be required for this duty starting in June. Hymnals and missalettes have been removed from pews and stored for a later date. Signs are posted prominently on all doors. The floor is marked with tape at six-foot intervals approaching the communion stations.

SACRAMENTS & RELIGIOUS ED

First Communion, Confirmation and Religious Education Classes for the Fall will be discussed soon. That information will be given as soon as possible.

The social guidance all individuals must follow to reduce the risk of new COVID-19 transmission:

- Cover your face
- Wash your hands
- Socially distance
- Be vigilant for symptoms
- Stay home if you feel sick

In the light of the continuing and specific danger presented by this virus to older people and those with certain health conditions, the obligation to take part in the Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation continues to be lifted.
