PEOPLE ARRIVING AT CHURCH:

Wear your mask at Church every time you come.

To help you maintain social distancing, every other pew is closed off. No collection will be taken up by ushers, but baskets are placed for you to drop your envelope of donation as you leave. A thorough sanitizing of the church has taken place and the church will be cleaned again after each service. Hymnals and missalettes have been removed from pews and stored for a later date. Signs are posted prominently on all doors. The floor is marked with tape at six-foot intervals approaching the communion stations.

Please do not jam up the doorways as you leave but enter and exit quickly.

For Holy Communion you may remove your masks as Deacon Jim and Fr. Fran will be masked for communion. We ask that you come for Communion one pew at a time respecting the six-foot markings on the floor.

Choirs will not be restored but will be phased in over time as the restriction is lifted. We will sing only the Proper parts of the Mass.

The offertory procession is lifted. If you have a Mass booked for a loved one there will be no presenting of the gifts. If you are a server, reader, or Minister of the Eucharist your ministries will be phased in over time.

For now, only Deacon Jim, Fr. Fran and a reader will be in the sanctuary. This is so Deacon and Fr. Fran will not have to be masked during Mass but only at Communion.

There will be no sign of peace so that contact is avoided. At the beginning and end of Mass there will be no procession thru the congregation.

Please do not focus on what we cannot do but rather on what we can do. We now can gather for worship, be enlightened by the Word of God, and receive the Eucharist. Is that not all we want and need? All these measures are for our safety and will be tweaked as we move forward. Many of these restrictions will be lifted over time as we come closer to our “new normal”.

In the light of the continuing and specific danger presented by this virus to older people and those with certain health conditions, the obligation to take part in the Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation continues to be lifted.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS

Another school Year is upon us. What that year will look like is anyone’s guess. Even school districts are unable to give confident guidance as to what we should expect. With that in mind we have decided NOT to have students return this Fall. We take the safety of our students and teachers as the highest priority. We cannot guarantee their safety in our facility which does not lend itself to social distancing.

We are in the process of selecting materials that are grade appropriate so that learning can continue at home. Teachers will offer support by phone monthly, especially for those students in a Sacraments Program. We will try and return students to class if safe to do so in January of 2021.

Even though there will be no class time in the Fall, we ask you to register in the fall as usual just to be sure we have contact information that is accurate and up to date. Registration forms can be found on our parish website under the Religious Education Tab.
