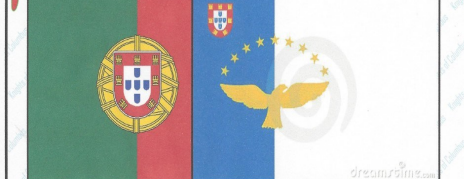
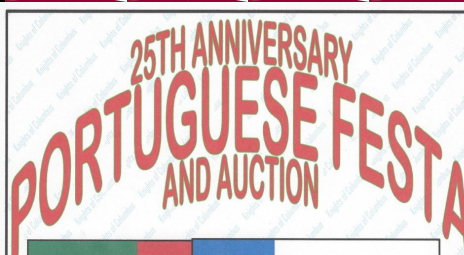
All proceeds will go towards the safe and humane bat removal account. Pre-sale tickets will be sold after English and Spanish Masses.
