Psalm 51: 3-4, 12-13, 17, 19

-First Reading

Exodus 32:7-11, 13-14

The book of Exodus tells of the Israelites' escape from Egypt and their covenant with God at Mount Sinai. In today's passage, Moses has been up on the mountain for 40 days conversing with God. In his absence, the Israelites have despaired and built a golden calf to worship as a god.

-Second Reading

1 Timothy 1: 12-17

The first letter to Timothy was written about 30 years after Paul's death. It was written in Paul's name, a practice common in the ancient world. In today's portion of this letter, the unknown author sketches a portrait of Paul as someone we should imitate.

Since you speak of peace, all the more must you have peace in your hearts. Let no one be provoked to anger or scandal by you, but may they be drawn to peace and good will, to kindness and concord through your gentleness. RCIA:

Our meetings are on Thursday at 6:00pm in the Parish Center. It is not too late to join us. The early weeks of the RCIA classes are a time of prayer, instruction and discernment to prepare for the reception of the sacraments at the Easter Vigil.

We also need parishioners to help in other ways to make the program successful. Below are ways you can help.

Hospitality: This is an opportunity to provide refreshments for the session. Community building starts with hospitality and this ministry can be shared in various ways.

Benefactor: Through the benefactor donations, the candidates are provided with a Bible and the instruction materials needed for the program.

Adopt-a-Candidate: This is a promise to pray for a candidate during the year. We let them know of your "adoption" by giving them a card that they can insert in their bibles as a reminder of your prayers.

Sponsors: A candidate may be apprehensive about asking questions about the Church or approaching the priest about a problem. The sponsor acts as a support for the candidate during the program and attends as many sessions with the candidate as possible. The role of Sponsor should not be confused with that of a Godparents for baptism though a person may act as both.

Facilitator: A facilitator helps the Candidates understand the subject for discussion at a particular session. A member of the RCIA team or Father is present at every session to help with this discussions.
