At that time, they were a nation subject to Syria whose king tried to force them to abandon their religious customs. Today’s passage describes the resistance of one family, whose bravery became legendary.

2 Thessalonians 2:16-3:5
 The two letters to the Thessalonians were addressed to a Christian community founded by Paul early in his missionary travels. Thessalonica was located in the northeastern portion of modern-day Greece. Early Christians believed that Jesus would return soon; these letters address how they ought to live as they await that coming.

We are unable to continue operating The Food Bank any longer, because of health reasons, and shortage of workers at First So. Baptist Church.

The Food Bank will continue operations, but at a different location and name. All future monetary donations may be made to Willows Adventist Community Services, P. O. Box 1066. Any other donations may be dropped off at 545 First Avenue. This is beginning Dec. 1st. We will continue operating the Food Bank at 444 Tehama St until then.

We were very distraught in the beginning, because no other Church or non-profit organization wanted to take over the operation. God is so good, and provided us with a solution. So without too much inconvenience effective Dec 1st we will be at a new location and new hours. Mon 9a.m. to 11 a.m. The Commodities distribution will still continue each month at the first Southern Baptist Church 112 N Yolo. The Food Bank has been providing food to over 450 people each month for the last eight years. My hope and prayers are that this community will continue its faithful support as long as it is needed. We have over 150 homeless and at least 36 displaced families from the fire not to mention our seniors and disabled that live on fixed incomes and depend on us for help. PLEASE don't forget us. God bless each of you, and thank you for making the last eight years a joy.
