



Results from Most Holy Trinity Parishioner Feedback Survey

Regarding MHT's COVID response

Mass streaming

- Many appreciated our online mass streaming and the parish-based ministry and sense of community it provided.
- Recognizing this, we quickly worked to improve our online broadcast, utilizing our in Church media system and initiating a parish YouTube channel
- We will continue with online mass streaming: one each weekend and weekdays

COVID reality

- Those expressing a **concern about vulnerability** are encouraged to continue to make prudent decisions about their mass attendance, as long as COVID is a prevalent issue.
- Those expressing a **concern about our social distancing protocol**
 - *MHT will encourage mass attendees to be mindful of their safe distancing when being seated as stated in the announcements before each mass.
 - *As long as wearing a mask is mandated everyone will be encouraged to wear one.
 - *Attending daily mass may be an option. Since there are fewer people attending it is easier to social distance.
- We have cleaning protocol for the parish that is being followed.
- Faithfully in Touch Ministry attempted to contact all parishioners with the current information we have on file to check in with everyone.

Responses to individual comments: We will reflect on more comments in the days ahead, but will comment on a few here.


Gatherings: As circumstances allow, we fully intend to resume meetings, events, and gatherings, as is prudent. Some have already resumed. See bulletin.
