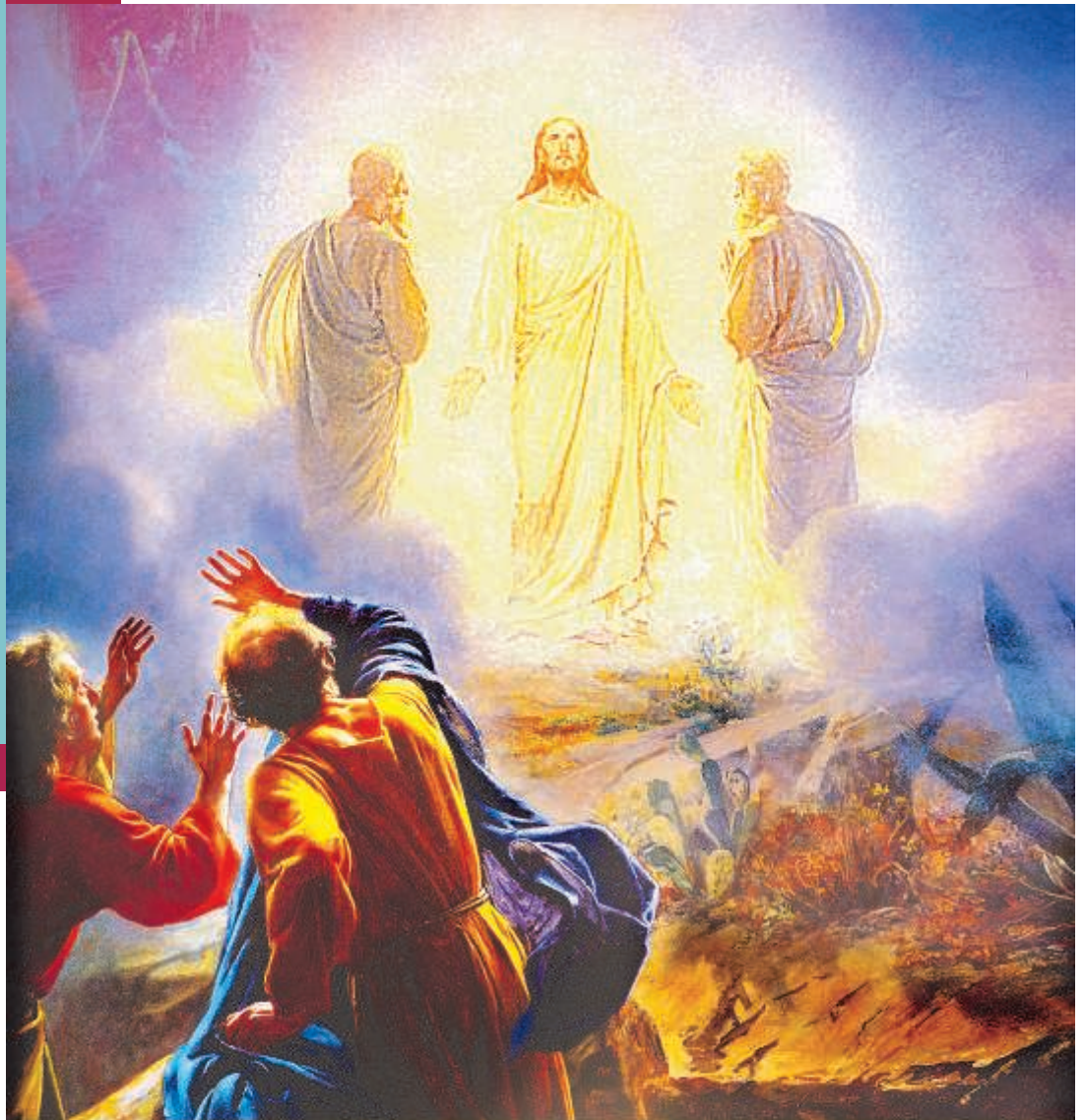

Second Sunday of Lent  
March 17, 2019

Dear Friends,

Today's gospel reading from Luke describes Jesus's transfiguration before Peter, James, and John. Seeing Jesus in His transfigured state must have been an extraordinary experience for these apostles. They saw the Lord speaking to Moses and Elijah about His passion and sacrificial death. Peter wished to erect a tent for Jesus, Moses, and Elijah. As they entered the cloud above them they heard the words, "This is my chosen Son; listen to Him."

They heard the voice of the Eternal Father. It seems that if these apostles had any question of whom Jesus was, the doubt must have left them after that experience. I am sure that Peter, James, and John would have liked to stay there forever. However, this experience ended as quickly as it began. Jesus' glory would be for another time. His sacrifice of Himself for the salvation of humanity would soon be upon them.

During the liturgies of Lent, let us listen attentively to the readings from Sacred Scripture. We should reflect upon their meaning and be inspired by the messages proclaimed in the Gospels, as well as the readings from the Old and New Testaments. In this way, we can contemplate the ways in which God has interacted with His people throughout salvation history.

Let us believe in the person of Jesus with much fervency and perseverance. Through prayer, worship, and charitable works, we can spiritually connect with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We need to be devoted to the Holy Eucharist and the Sacrament of Penance. In this way, the grace of God will help us to continue to be devoted servants of our loving God.

# Good News!

March 17, 2019

*Second Sunday of Lent (C)*

Gn 15:5-12, 17-18; Phil 3:17-4:1 or

Phil 3:20-4:1; Lk 9:28b-36

The same three apostles who are present in the Garden of Gethsemane are also at the transfiguration. On both occasions they fall asleep! But when they awake at the transfiguration, they see something totally different. They see Jesus radiant and resplendent like they had never seen him before. This revelation of his glory is meant to strengthen their faith and prepare them for seeing Jesus later, sweating blood in the agony of the Garden. Experiencing the joy and beauty of Jesus is essential to persevering through the inevitable passions we will have to undergo. Faith is not all about suffering, but about joy, love, and intimacy with Christ. Yes, love sometimes means we must suffer, but the fruit is greater intimacy. A diamond is made under great pressure and love must pass through temptations.

All three synoptic Gospels unite the transfiguration with Peter's profession of faith. The reality of the passion and cross should not shake the apostle's faith, but they should realize that his exaltation can only be accomplished in the cross: "And when I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself" (John 12:32).

The sufferings we see in the world, in our own past and present, shouldn't shake our faith in Jesus, either. Overcoming sin comes from embracing suffering.

Jesus is so radiant that he awakes the apostles from their slumber. May the consuming love with which we burn for Jesus transfigure us into beautiful lights that awaken this world from its slumber of faith as well.

## CHURCH HALL RENOVATIONS

The need for this work is the result of the frozen pipe in the radiator of the "crying room" that flooded the two classrooms in the Church hall on January 23rd. Since the inspection showed that there is asbestos in the floor tiles, and with many of the tiles cracked and worn throughout the hall, it has been recommended by the Diocese that the parish undertake this work.

The floor and the carpeting in the two classrooms will be removed, and the flooring will be replaced. The ceiling in the classrooms will be renovated and painted. The ceiling and walls in the main hall will be painted, and the flooring in the hall will be replaced. The flooring in the bathrooms will be replaced, the walls will be painted, and new toilets will be installed. The price for this renovation will be approximately \$35,000 to \$40,000. There will be some reimbursement from the insurance company.
