LENTEN INSTRUCTIONS—2020

So that the Church of Metuchen may be spiritually one in a common observance of Lent, the following days of fast and abstinence are to be observed by all Catholics of the Diocese who enjoy the blessings of good health:

~The days of fast and abstinence are

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

~All other Fridays of Lent are

days of abstinence.

~ From the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday until the celebration of the Easter Vigil on the evening of Holy Saturday, the <u>Easter fast</u> should be observed so that, with uplifted and welcoming hearts, we may be ready to celebrate the joys of the Resurrection.

The obligation to <u>fast</u> applies only to Catholics <u>between</u> <u>the ages of 18 and 59</u>. To fast in the Catholic tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal during the day so as to experience hunger. The obligation of <u>abstinence</u> affects all Catholics who have <u>reached the age of 14</u>. Abstinence in the Catholic tradition means to abstain from meat and all meat products.

The obligation of fast and abstinence, as a whole, is a serious obligation. While failure to observe any penitential day in itself may not be considered serious, the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of them without good cause, would be considered a grave matter. Those unable to abstain for a valid reason on any given Friday of Lent are asked to perform some other penitential act, or to abstain on another day.

LENT HELP: GIVING UP TO GIVE MORE

DON'T BUY ANYTHING THAT YOU DON'T NEED. If you can live without it, we don't need it. Put the money saved in a jar and see how much we can save after 40 days. Put some into savings and/or donate the rest to our Parish or the missions.

NO GOSSIPING. If someone says something negative about another person, either say something nice or don't say anything at all.

SAY 3 ENCOURAGING THINGS TO SOMEONE EVERY DAY. You may think this is easy but try to say things that aren't the normal "Thanks" or "Good job". Try to do three out-of-the-box things: "I love how you always help the kids" or "I love how you work hard even when it is tough today."

REPLACE 30 MINUTES OF TV TIME (OR OTHER RECREATION) WITH 30 MINUTES OF DEVOTION OR PRAYER. Attend Mass, Stations of the Cross, read a devotional or the daily Lent Mass readings (with your family) and have a reflection/discussion about it. Even the young (and the young at heart) can learn and have fun doing this!

DO NOT COMPLAIN. Try to have a positive outlook on things. We don't realize how much we complain until we "give" ourselves to an attitude of gratitude.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

"Go forth from the land of your kinsfolk and from your father's house to a land that I will show you." Genesis 12:1 God calls all of us to leave behind our old ways and to follow Him, placing our complete trust in Him. Some of the old ways that we may have to struggle to leave behind might be materialism, selfishness and greed. Yet god promises to show us a new land and a better way to live. Remember what St. Teresa of Calcutta said, "God does not call us to be successful, God calls us to be faithful."
