# *Father's Thoughts*

My Dear Parish,

When Jesus came he had a message for us: "Repent, the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand!"

But many of us find it hard to imagine what Jesus is talking about when he speaks of the "Kingdom of Heaven." Jesus knew that so he also made comparisons for us to help us understand what the "Kingdom of Heaven" really is. These comparisons are called "parables."

The hard thing about Jesus' parables is that they don't always make sense to us when we first hear them. What does a mustard bush have to do with the coming of Christ? Or a farmer's field? Or a fishing net? Am I really missing out if the meaning of Jesus' parables are lost on me?

Some of Jesus' comparisons are easier to understand than others, such as the Good Samaritan. Some are very difficult, indeed, such as the Dishonest Steward. But in either case there is only one way for us to come to the meaning of all of the parables: ask Jesus! This is what his disciples do and he explains everything to them. It's what we should do. We should prayerfully ask him to explain to us what he wants us to know. "Ask and you shall receive."

Asking Jesus is also the way we should proceed even when we're not reading the bible. Whenever something comes our way that we don't quite understand it's always wise prayerfully and sincerely to consult the master.

May our parish seek with evermore diligence to find from our savior the way to the Kingdom of Heaven.
