Most Holy Trinity

Trinity Sunday celebrates one God, three persons, complete mystery. And the readings this week ground us in the simplicity of who God is and what God does for us.

The story of Moses on the mountain reveals a God who meets us on the mountains of our lives, who reveals his mercy and love, faithfulness and patience. When we ask God for what we need, he answers, even if his answers aren't as immediate or clear as the stone tablets. In the fullness of time, this same God reveals the plan for our salvation: Jesus is sent in human flesh to love us. By his life, death and rising, Jesus gives us the example of how to love and then gives us the gift of the Spirit.

So much of our spiritual life is participation in a mystery that is beyond our understanding, but the second reading offers us a simple guide and blessing. Live the moments of your life seeking peace with God and one another, and allow the healing grace of Jesus, the love of the Father, and the communion of the Spirit to be poured over you and everything your do.

May it be enough for us to live right in the middle of this mystery of God working love in and through our lives. May the father, Son and Holy Spirit flow through us to those most in need of God's simple and saving love.
