13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

As a parent, I can only imagine the utter panic that Jairus would have been feeling in today's Gospel. His beloved child is at death's door. Then just when there's a glimmer of hope that Jesus will save her, the news arrives: "Your daughter is dead." How devastated Jairus must have been at hearing those words!

But then Jesus speaks: "Do not fear, only believe." And amazingly, Jairus does! He doesn't know how this is going to end. What he does know, though, is that Jesus is with him through it. From the moment Jairus fell at his feet, Jesus has been walking with him... literally. And that belief, that trust, enables Jairus to continue on, even in the face of death.

Life is filled with difficult challenges; it's part of the human condition. And when we reach out to him, Jesus speaks these same words to each one of us. Life threatening illness? "Do not fear, only believe." A loved one ravaged by an addiction? "Do not fear, only believe." Seemingly irreparably broken relationships? "Do not fear, only believe."
