Saunders Catholic Mission Trips - In June of 2018 Bishop Neumann will be departing with over 60 students from Saunders County on two youth mission trips to Gallup, NM and Chicago, IL. The students will be working with the Missionaries of Charity and the Little Sisters of the Poor in soup kitchens, homeless shelters, nursing homes and in mission schools. Some of the service work includes feeding the homeless, preparing and serving at food kitchens, helping with building projects and maintenance work, and serving the elderly. The Mission Trips are entirely self-funded by the students and with generous donations from individuals and organizations. We are excited about the opportunity to serve and to minister to others in need, and we ask you to join us in this service work that Christ called us to do. We are seeking your support and prayers for this mission trip. The cost of the trip is \$400 per person to cover meals, transportation, lodging and financial assistance to the Sisters and homeless shelters. From the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

- God takes the initiative of universal redeeming love**
604 By giving up his own Son for our sins, God manifests that his plan for us is one of benevolent love, prior to any merit on our part: "In this is love, not that we loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the expiation for our sins."408 God "shows his love for us in that while we were yet sinners Christ died for us."409
605 At the end of the parable of the lost sheep Jesus recalled that God's love excludes no one: "So it is not the will of your Father who is in heaven that one of these little ones should perish."410 He affirms that he came "to give his life as a ransom for many"; this last term is not restrictive, but contrasts the whole of humanity with the unique person of the redeemer who hands himself over to save us.411 The Church, following the apostles, teaches that Christ died for all men without exception: "There is not, never has been, and never will be a single human being for whom Christ did not suffer."412
