### Be Shepherds with the Smell of the Sheep

This statement is one of the early introductions to Pope Francis' vision of priestly ministry. What Pope Francis is challenging priests to be are shepherds who know their parishioners well, who are familiar with both the fragrance of blessing and the odor of struggle.

Being in the midst of the sheep not only allows the shepherd to "rub shoulders / elbows" with the sheep – to know their smell – but it also allows the sheep to become familiar with the voice of the shepherd, because there are times when the shepherd must lead. There are also times when the shepherd must follow the sheep where they lead, because sheep seem to have an innate ability that allows them to find water and grass and to avoid danger.

To lead from the front – to be in the midst of – to follow after: what a great reminder for anyone who has a shepherd's role, either here at the parish or elsewhere. Which skill do I need to develop further?

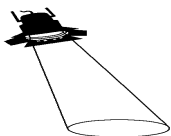

## TITHING

**May 2019 - 4 Sundays - \$967 each agency**

St. Agatha Center – Ministers to the poor within parish boundaries, includes food pantry and education center.

Sisters of Divine Providence (LaPosada) – Provides housing and shelter for indigent immigrants in San Benito, Texas.

Health Resource Center – Provides free healthcare access for North St. Louis community using supervised medical students from St. Louis University. Includes clinics for pediatrics, well women, healthy living, diabetes, cardiology, asthma, allergies and foot care.

St. Louis University Prison Program – An educational college prison program aimed at breaking the cycle of poverty and recidivism. SLU offers an Associate’s Degree program to the incarcerated, as well as prison staff, with a demonstrated reduction in repeat offenses from 65% to 15% for those who complete the program.

St. Stephen Catholic Church – Provides assistance for rural parish in Richwood, MO. Parish serves a very poor area of the state and their need is great.

Blood of Christ Parish, Bolivia – Provides missionary presence in the rural area of La Paz. Sangre de Cristo is one of the many priestless missions in Bolivia.

Carondelet Betterment Foundation Food Pantry – Supports the city neighborhood through multiple social programs and in particular, through their food pantry, serving hundreds of families each month.

Redemptorists in Thailand – Assists children who have been orphaned or abandoned by parents with AIDS. Mothers and children who have the disease are also under care.

Sisters of Divine Providence (Room at the Inn) – Assists their Room at the Inn shelter for homeless women and children in St. Louis.

The Family Center – Provides annual counseling, spiritual direction, educational programs, group facilitation and outreach for those otherwise unable to afford the Center’s services. The Mary Margaret Program reaches out to low-income families, especially single mothers with children.

Father Bob’s Outreach – Offers financial assistance and counseling for utility and rental obligations and provides assistance to families in bereavement.

Center for Women in Transition – Assists women as they transition from the criminal justice system back to their families and community.

English Tutoring Project - Supports the teaching of English to children from immigrant and refugee families at four Catholic elementary schools in the metro area.
